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Executive Summary

INTRODUCTION

This Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) was conducted on behalf of Genesis Medical Center –Aledo. This CHNA report yields information specific to the community, allowing for independent determination of health priorities.

Genesis Medical Center, Aledo (GMC-Aledo) has served Mercer County and surrounding communities with compassionate, high quality care since 1950. Throughout the years, the hospital has successfully responded to an evolving health care delivery system. GMC-Aledo is a nonprofit, charitable organization governed by the Genesis Health System Board of Directors. As a member of Genesis Health System, GMC-Aledo patients have access to extended services that a community hospital otherwise may not provide. The hospital is accredited by The Joint Commission (TJC) which ensures that high standards of patient care are met.

Community Definition

The community defined for this assessment is Mercer County in Illinois. A demographic description of the targeted population can be found in the first set of tables of the “Detailed Health Indicators” section of this report.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Methods & Approach

To complete this CHNA, existing health-related data was collected via the online Community Commons Community Health Needs Assessment report tool at <http://www.communitycommons.org/maps-data>. This site allows for identification of 87 distinct health and social indicators at the county level, along with comparisons to state and national data, and Healthy People 2020 Targets, where available. Once an indicator report was generated, relevant indicators were reviewed to determine how Mercer County compared to available state/national data. See the “Detailed Health Indicators” section of this document.

Information Gaps

Because this CHNA relies on existing datasets, it is limited in scope to those indicators currently available through database collection. It does not include a primary research component, and many important issues are unaddressed (e.g., mental health, children’s health, etc.), or only addressed minimally (e.g., access to healthcare). Another limitation is that most measures included in this assessment represent data that are several years old.

Community Stakeholder Input

As part of this CHNA, GMC - Aledo partnered with the Mercer County Public Health Department and sought input from public health representatives and other community stakeholders with an interest in the health of the community through a series of discussion meetings.

Supportive Data

Public Health IPLAN. At least every five years, local boards of health lead a community-wide discussion with stakeholders and residents about their community’s health needs. After identifying needs in the community, the next step is to identify objectives and strategies to address those needs. This process - Illinois Project for Local Assessment of Needs (IPLAN) - is a fundamental element in statewide planning. IPLAN has more than a 20-year history in Illinois and represents local action to promote and protect the health of Illinoisans.

Recent IPLAN activities in Mercer County relate to several of the health needs identified in the quantitative data review described above. These include the following health issues:

Alcohol, Tobacco & Other Drugs — Identified tobacco use as an issue and developed strategies to increase awareness and expand monitoring programs.

Vaccine Preventable Diseases — Identified vaccinations as a problem and developed strategies to monitor and increase vaccination rates.

Nutrition, Physical Activity & Weight — Identified obesity as a problem and developed strategies to track weight status and promote healthy lifestyles.

Prioritization of Health Needs

To prioritize the CHNA findings the community, the stakeholder group reviewed the CHNA data and prioritized the identified health needs to establish which would be best addressed. The group considered several criteria in deciding which of the health needs to focus on, including the following:

Magnitude — *How many people are affected by a given health issue? How do we vary from state or national benchmarks? Healthy People 2020 targets?*

Seriousness & Impact — *To what degree does this health issue lead to death or disability, or impair quality of life? To what degree does this health issue impact other quality of life and health-related issues?*

Feasibility — *What is the likelihood of impacting this health issue, given available resources?* **Consequences of Inaction** — *What is the risk of exacerbating the problem by not addressing it at the earliest opportunity?*

Community Stakeholder Input — *Was this issue identified as a need in the community stakeholder meetings? What vulnerable populations were identified?*

The community stakeholder group met on April 11, 2018 and May 17, 2018 to review the data and discuss the opportunities for improvement. The committee also reviewed the 2015 plan and progress to date on the issues identified in 2015. The committee agreed to keep the same key areas while adding exploration of cancer in access to health care.

1. Oral Health
2. Nutrition, Physical Activity & Weight
3. Mental Health and Substance Abuse
4. Access to Health Care including cancer screenings

2018 Goals:

- Increase access to oral health for youth and seniors
- Mercer County residents will support, promote, and implement practices as it relates to healthy behaviors and wellbeing of individuals and families
- Mercer County will increase community access to mental health and substance abuse information, programs, resources and services
- Ensure equal access to health care for all

The remaining identified health needs were not deemed as significant, and a priority for these was not established for GMC-Aledo.

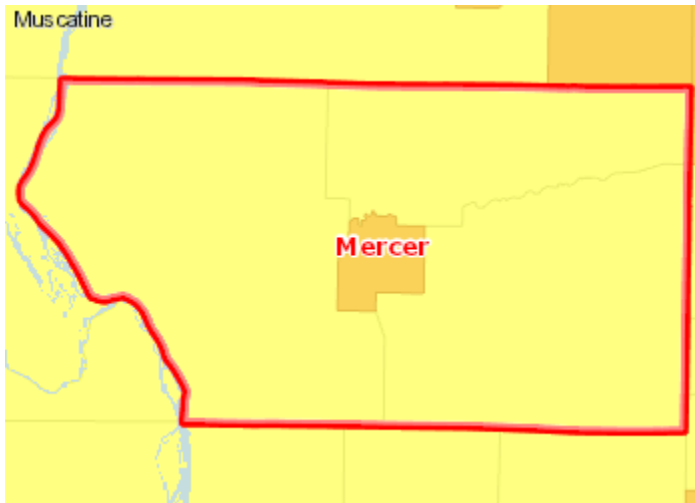

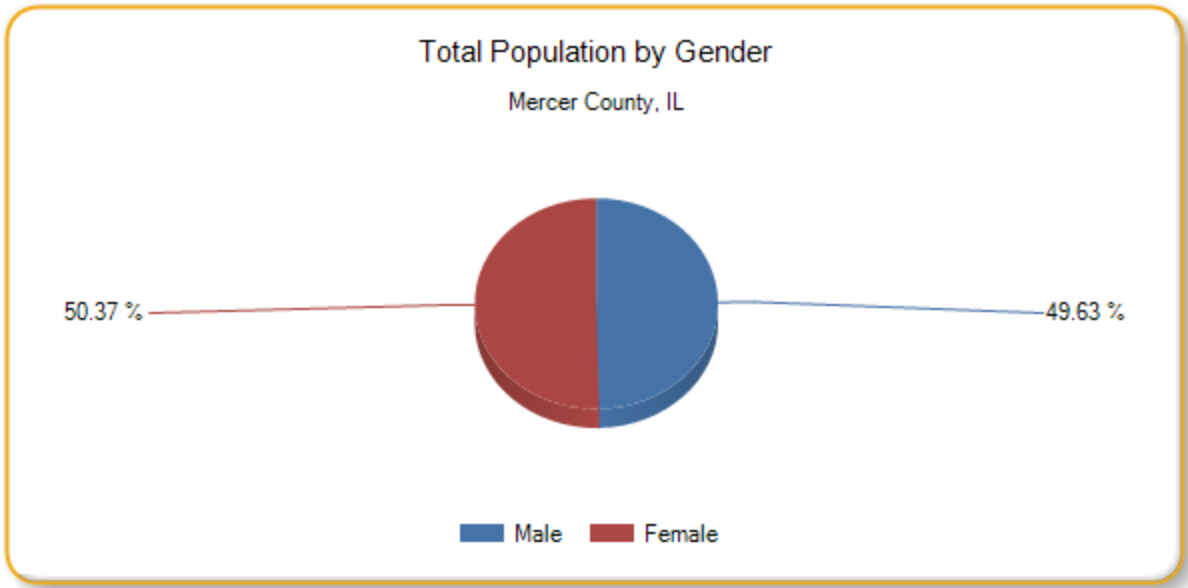


Population, Density (Persons per Sq. Mile) by Tract, ACS 2011-15



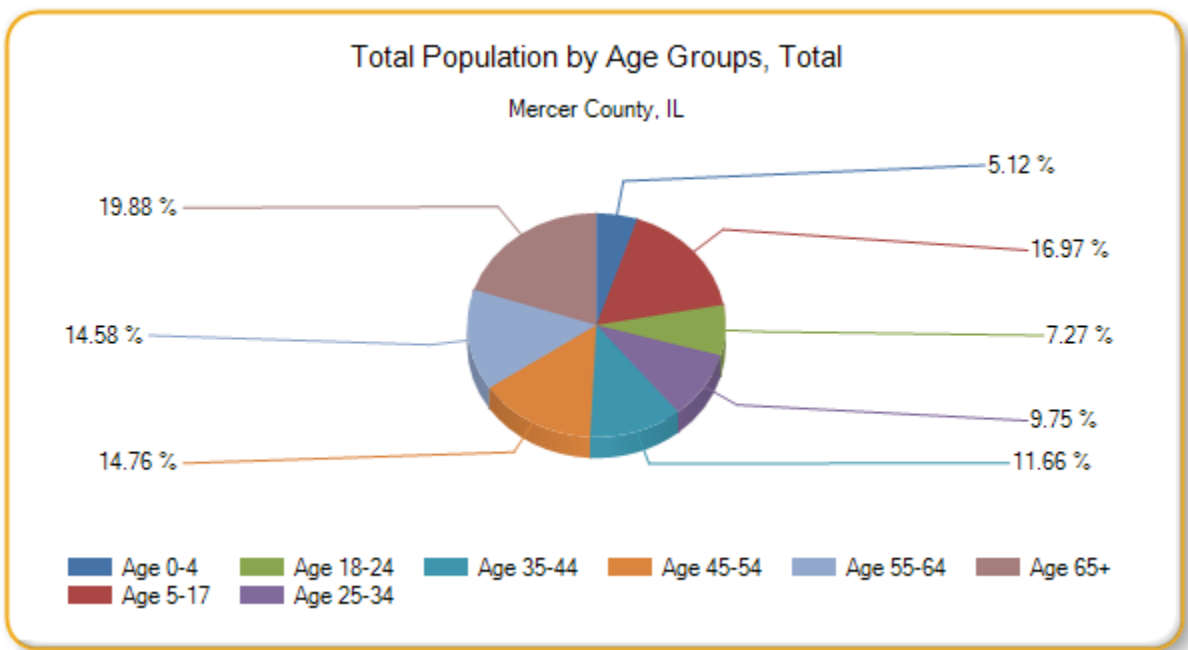

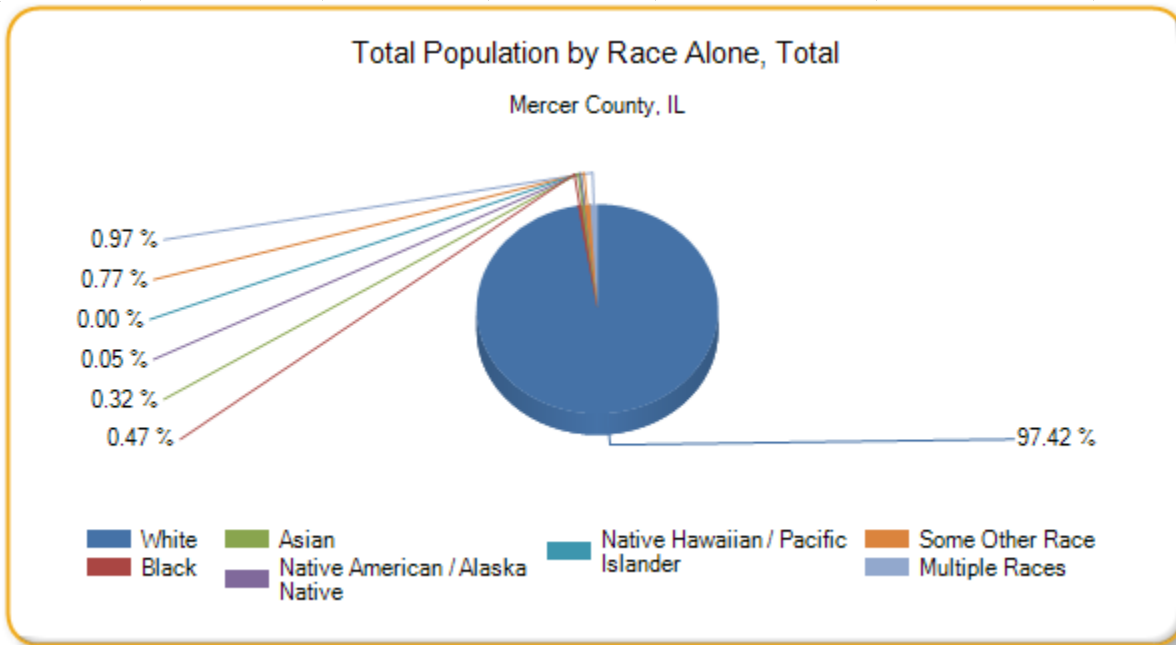

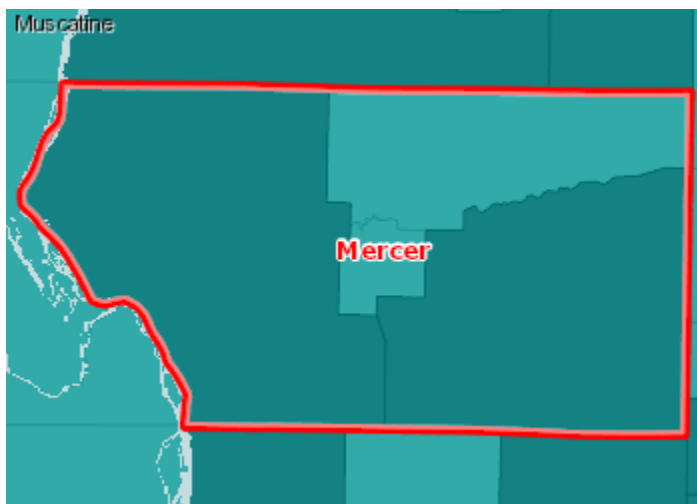

Median Age by Tract, ACS 2011-15

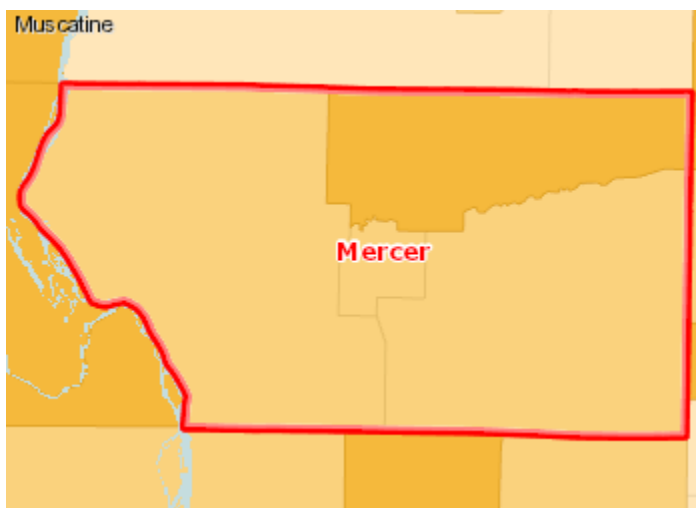

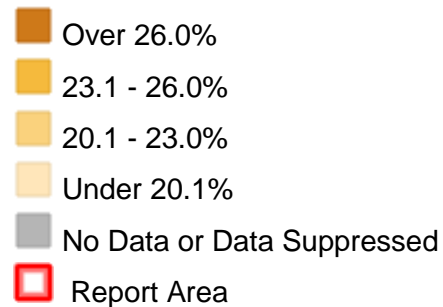

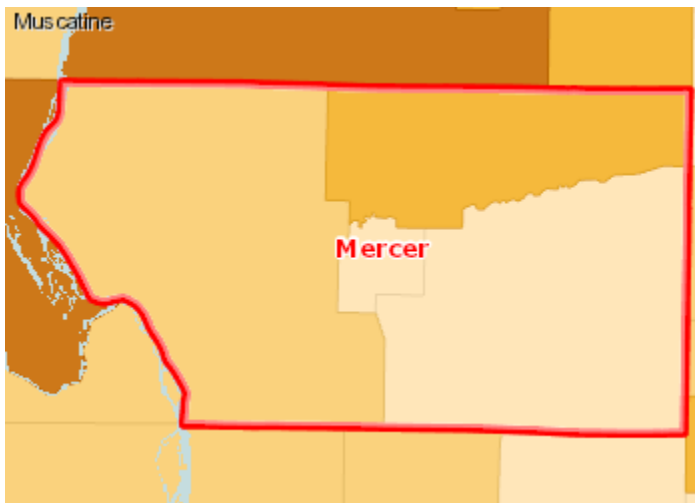

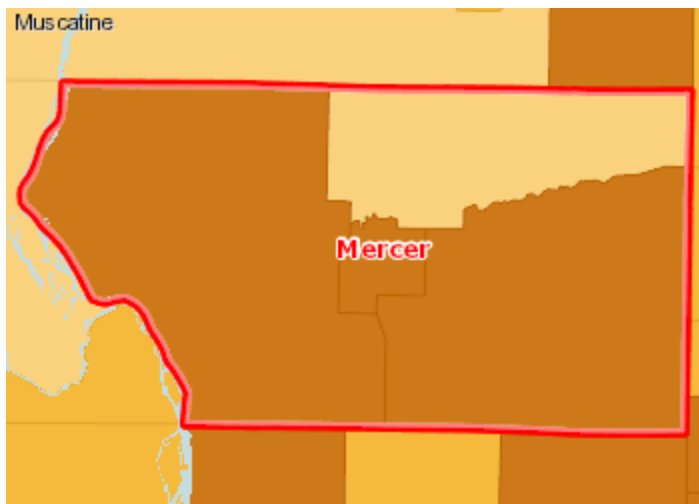

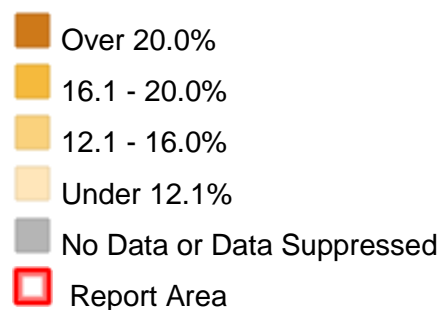

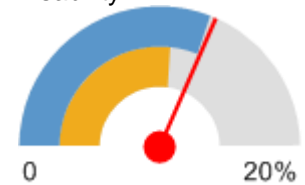

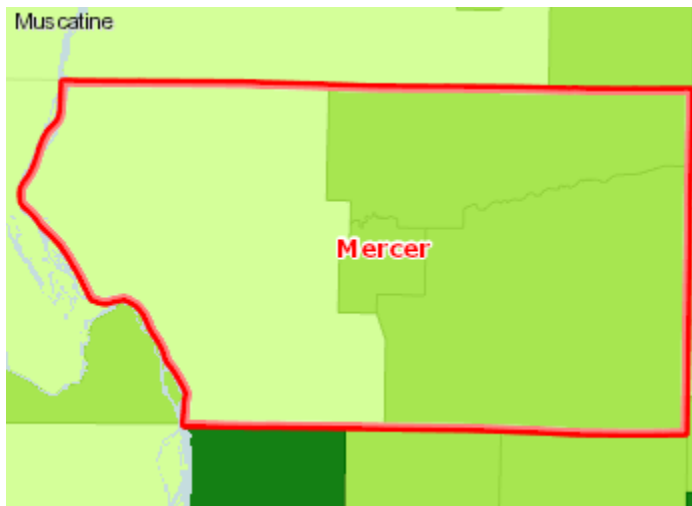

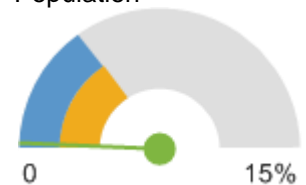

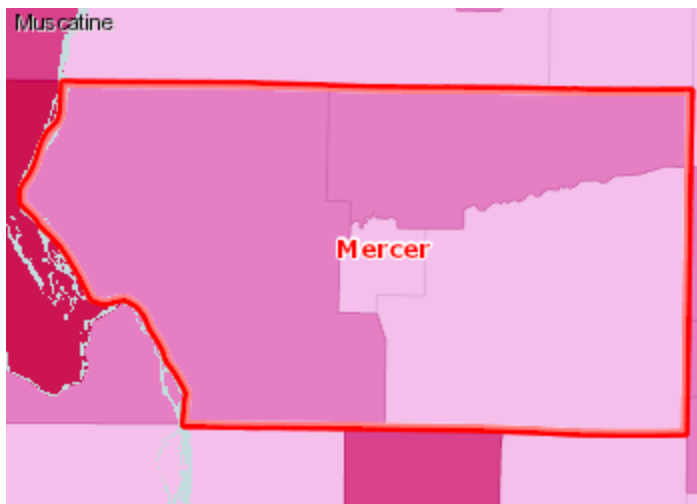

Population in Linguistically Isolated Households, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

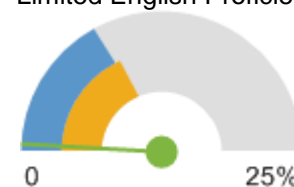

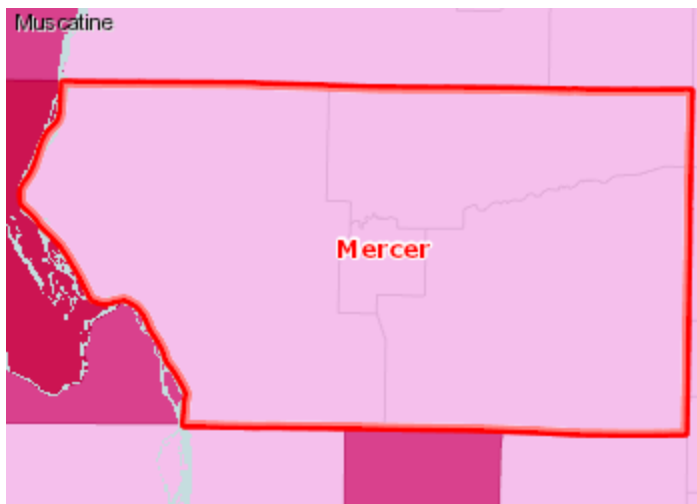

Percent Population Age 5 with Limited English Proficiency

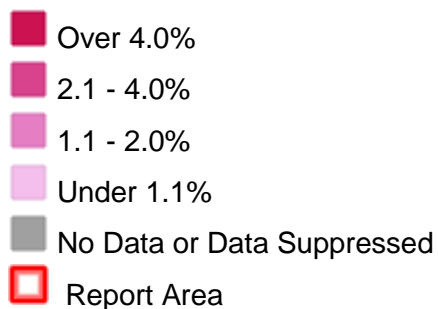

Population with Limited English Proficiency by Language Spoken at Home (4-Category)

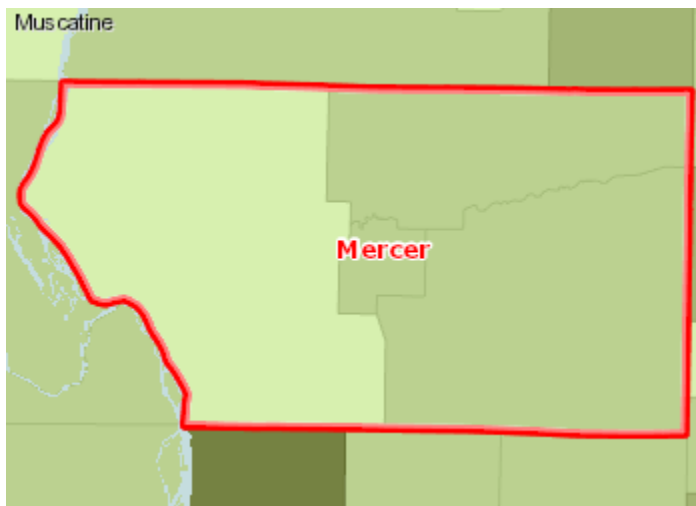

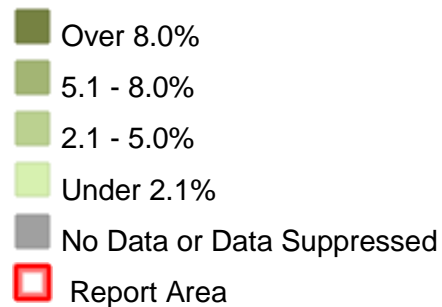

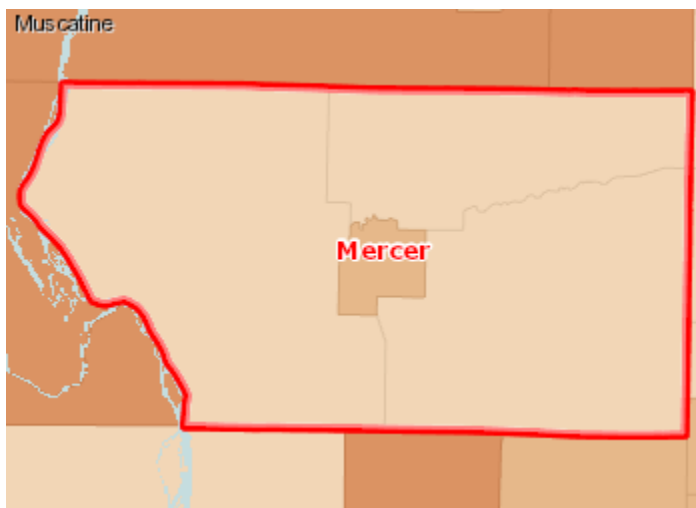

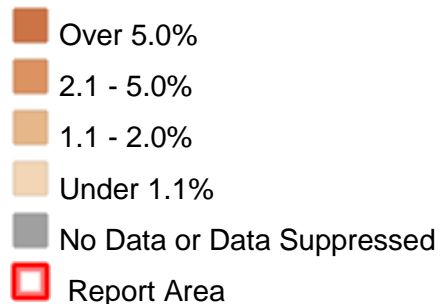

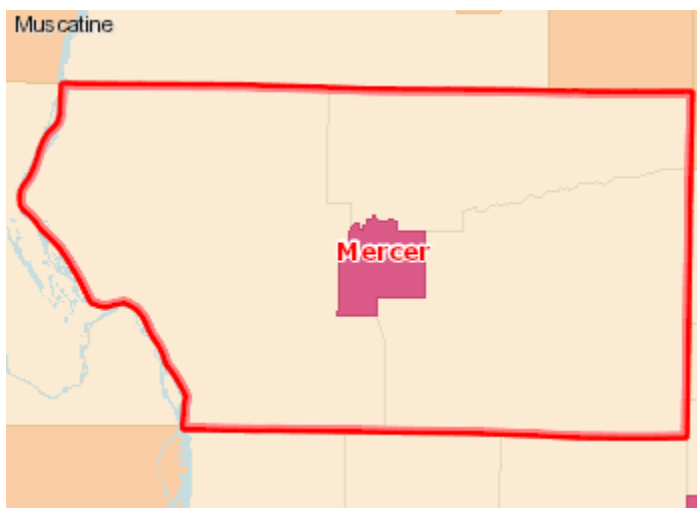

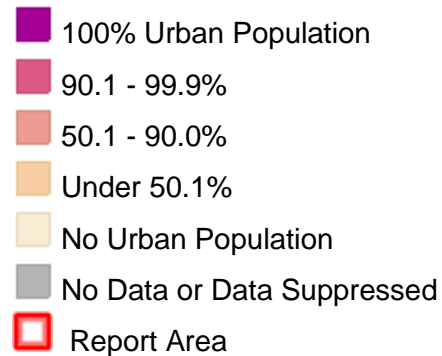

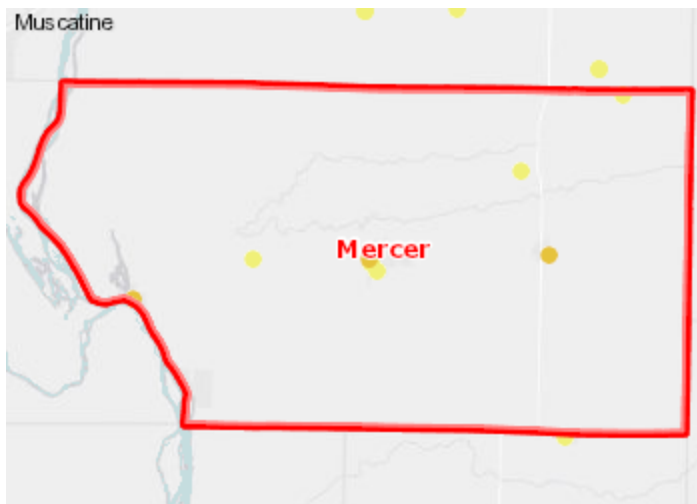

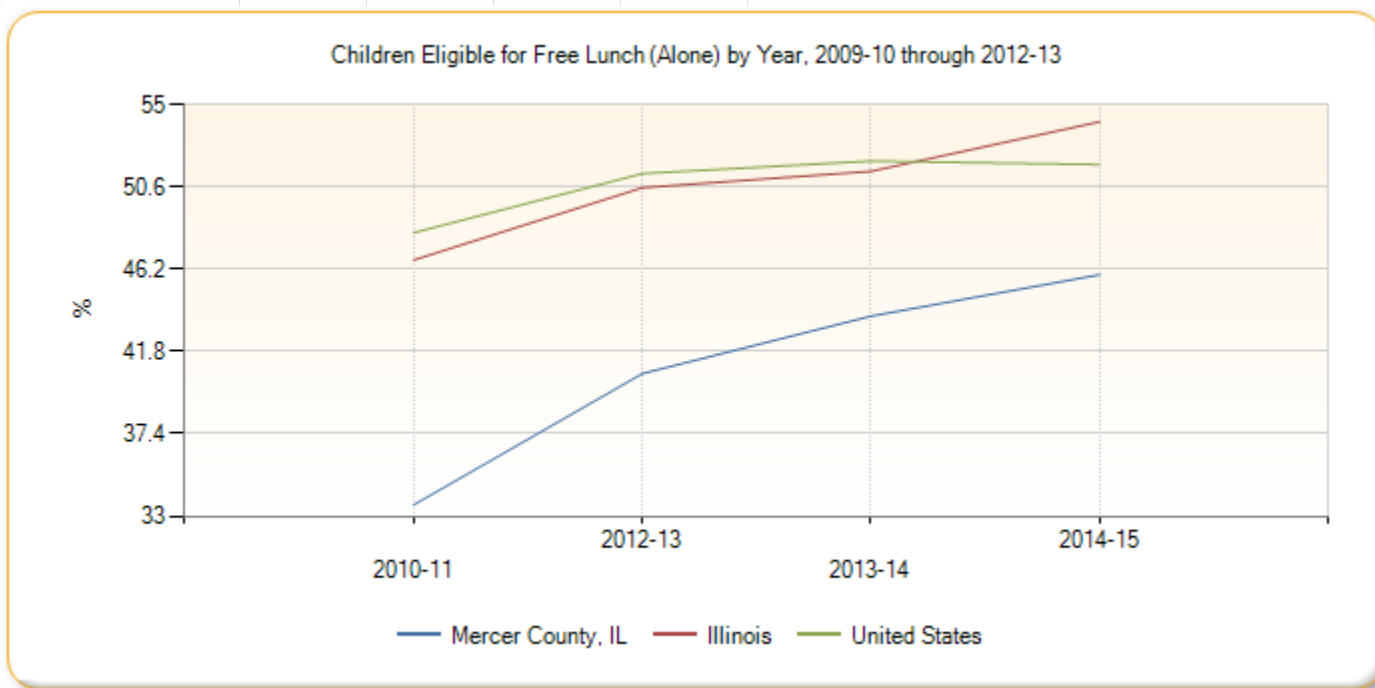

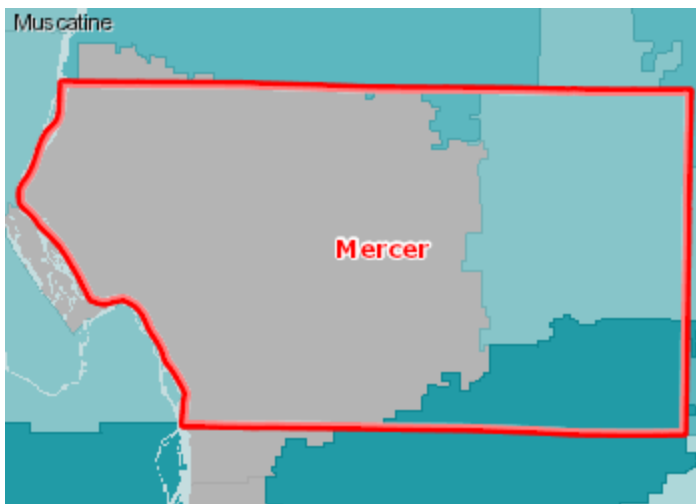

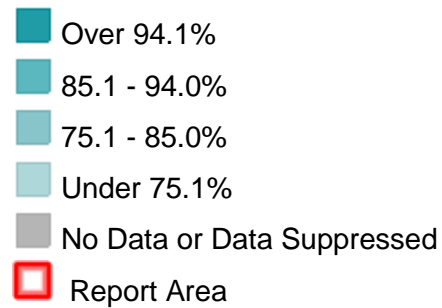
On-Time Graduation Rate

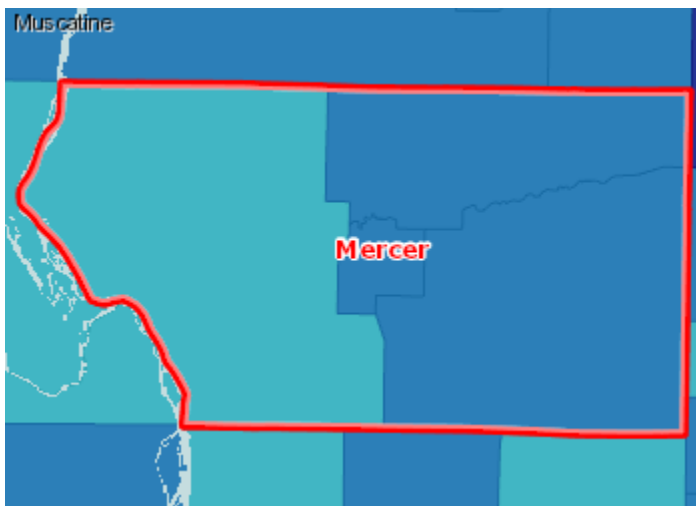

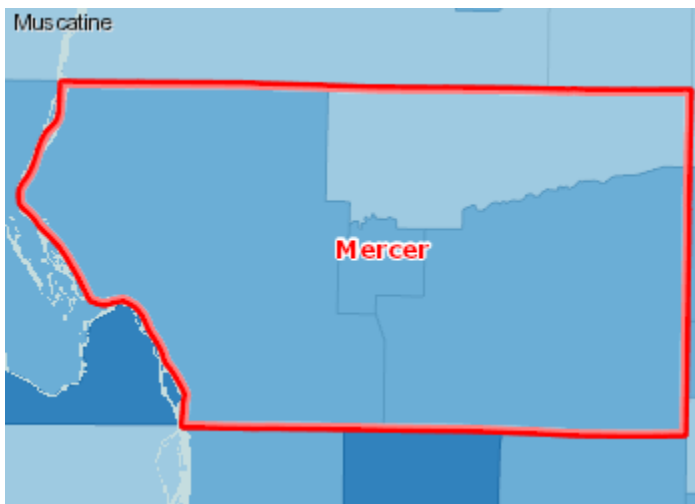

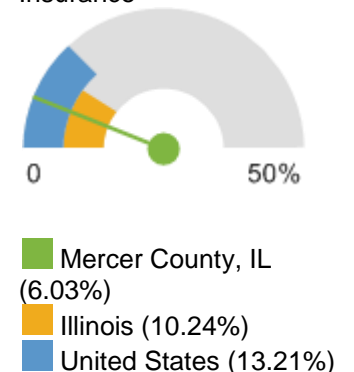

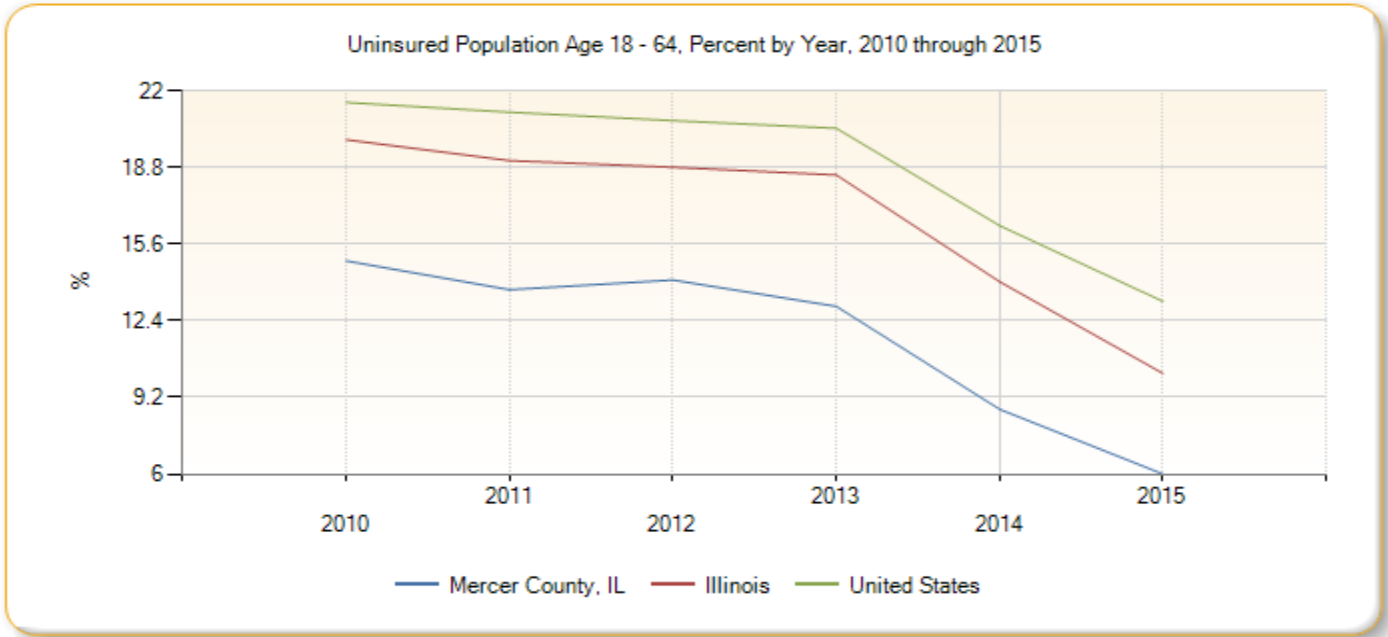


Uninsured Population, Age 18-64, Percent by County, SAHIE 2015

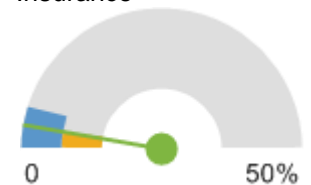

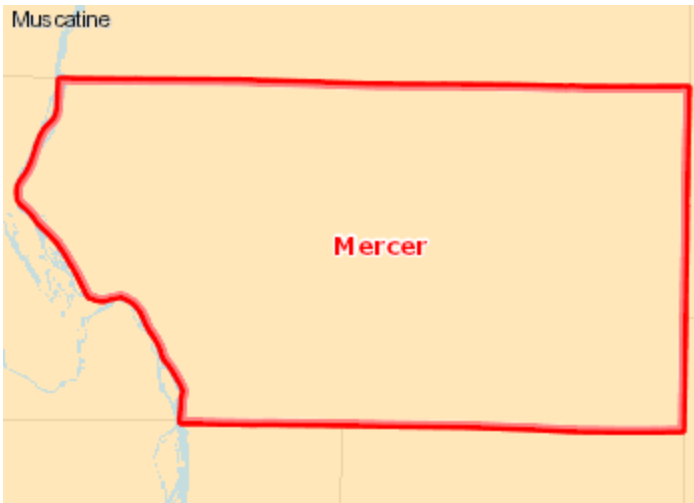

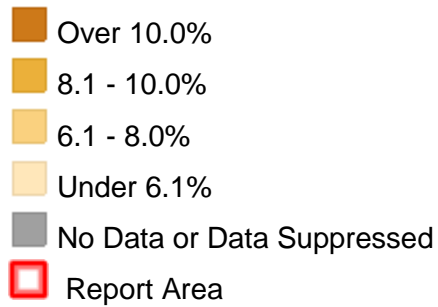
Percent Population Under Age 19 Without Medical Insurance

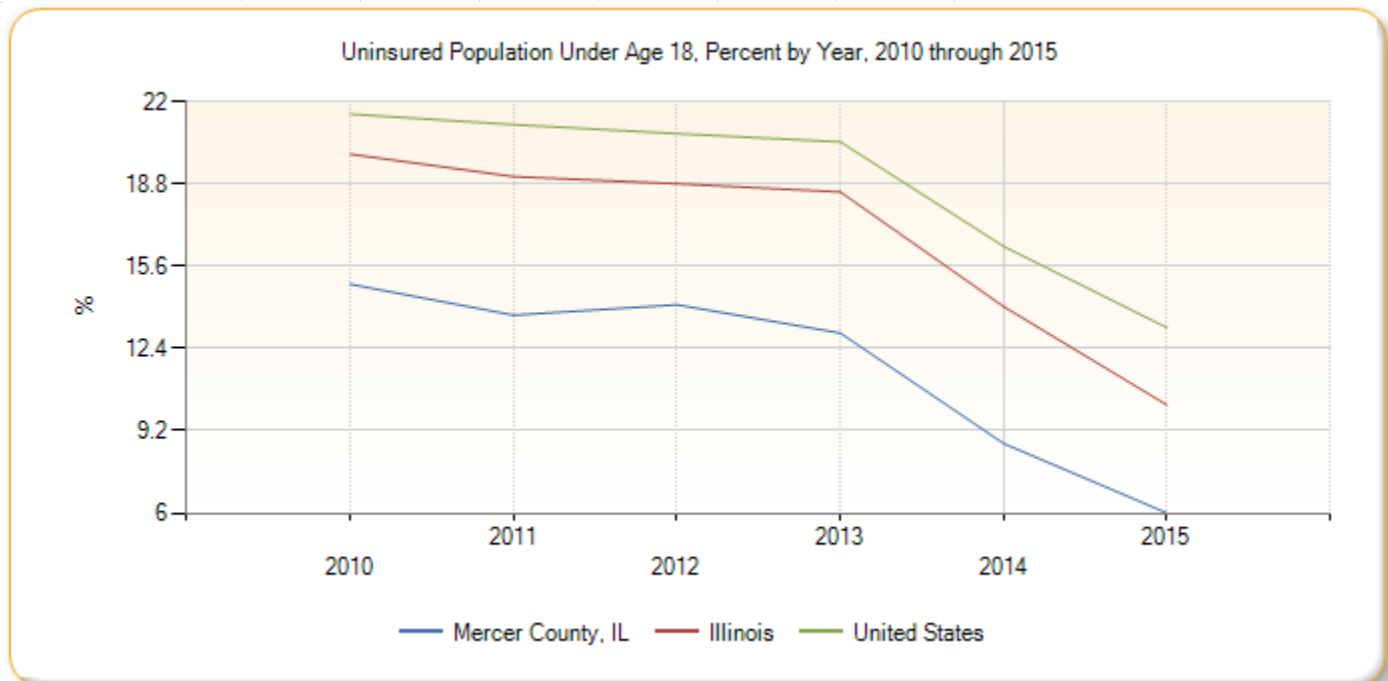


Uninsured Population, Age 0-18, Percent by County, SAHIE 2014

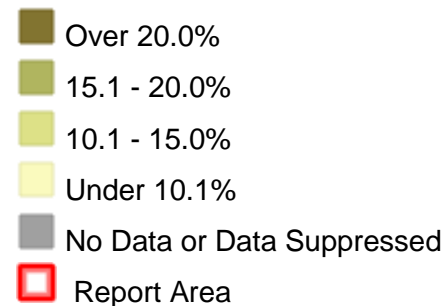

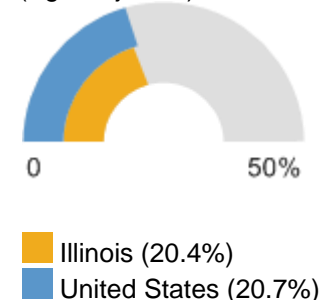

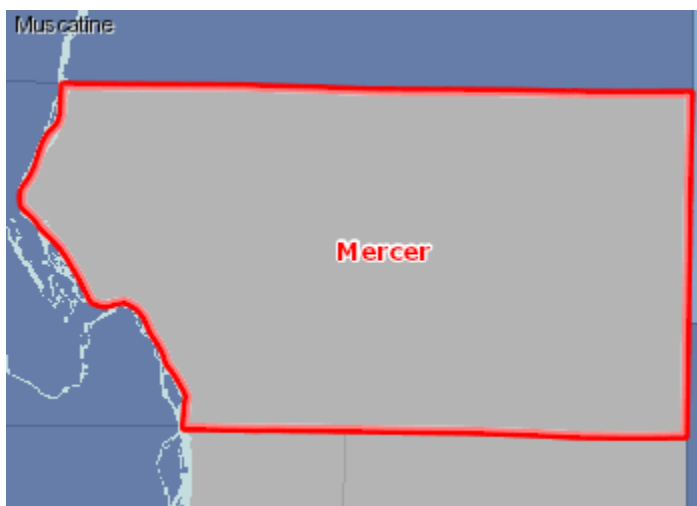

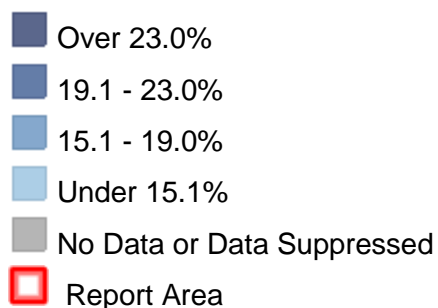
Percent Adults Without Adequate Social / Emotional Support (Age-Adjusted)

Inadequate Social/Emotional Support, Percent of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

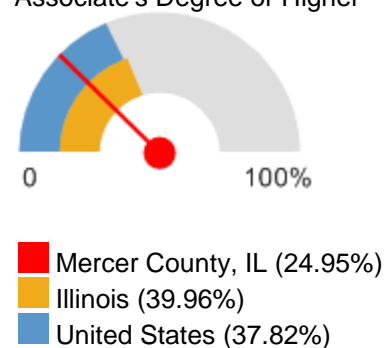

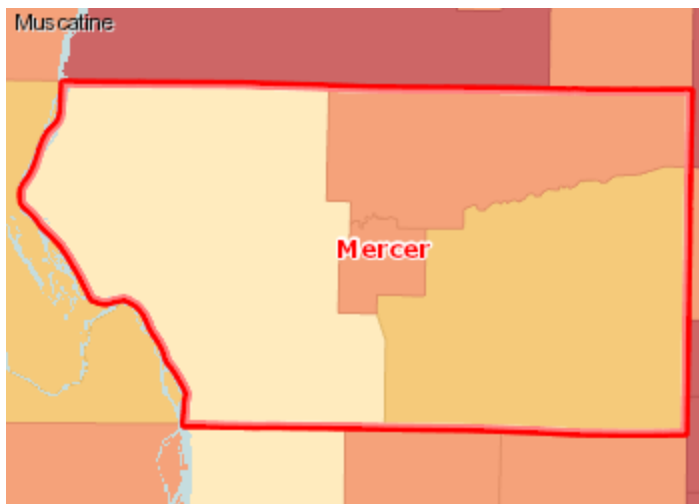

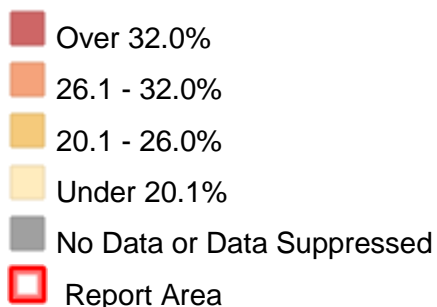
Percent Population Age 25 with Associate's Degree or Higher

Population with an Associate Level Degree or Higher, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

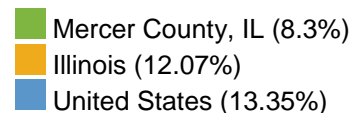
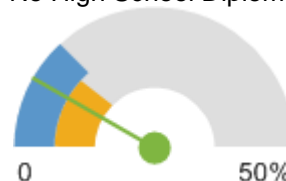

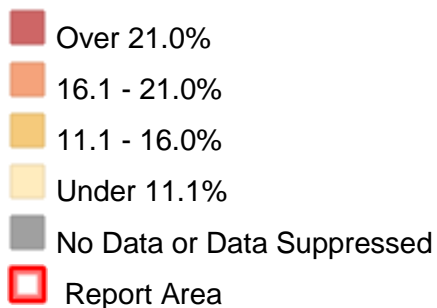
Percent Population Age 25 with No High School Diploma

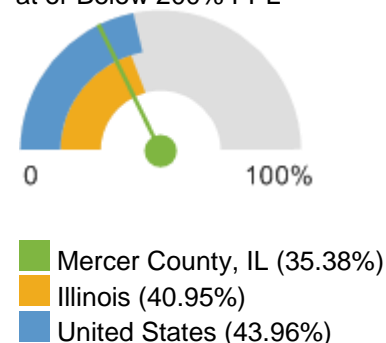

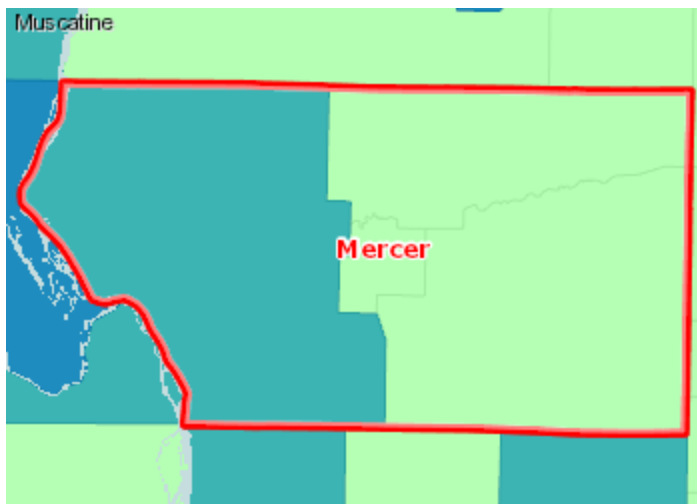

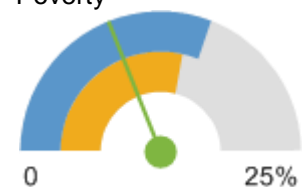

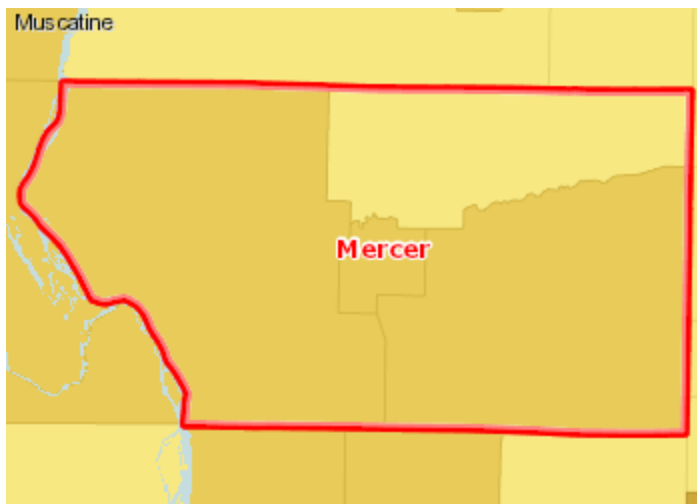

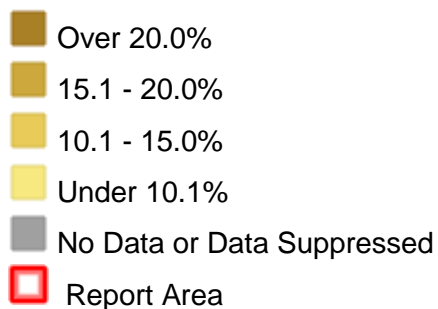
Percent Population in Poverty

Population in Poverty by Gender

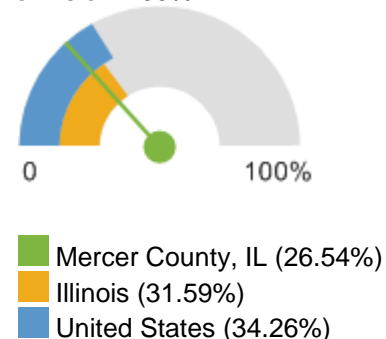

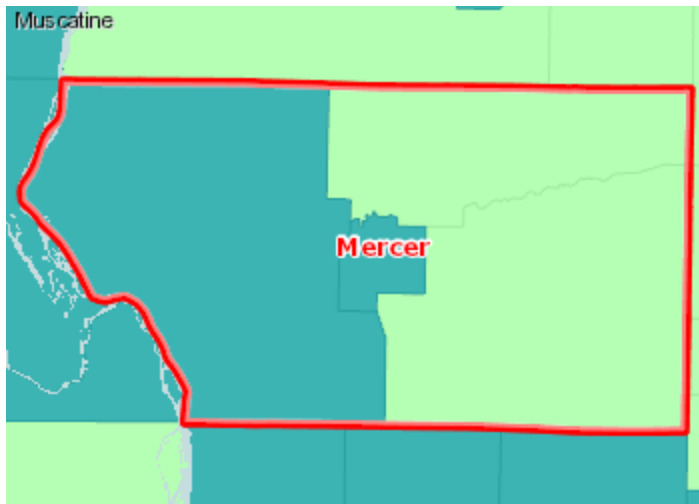

Population Below 200% Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

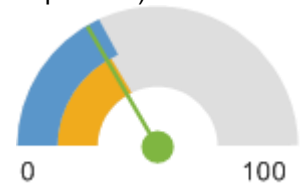

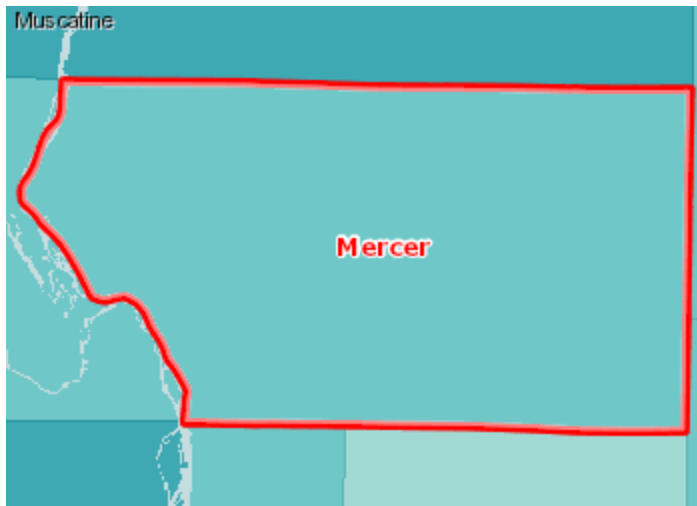

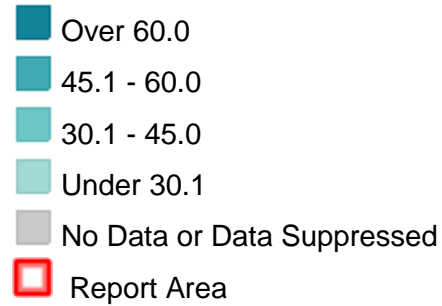

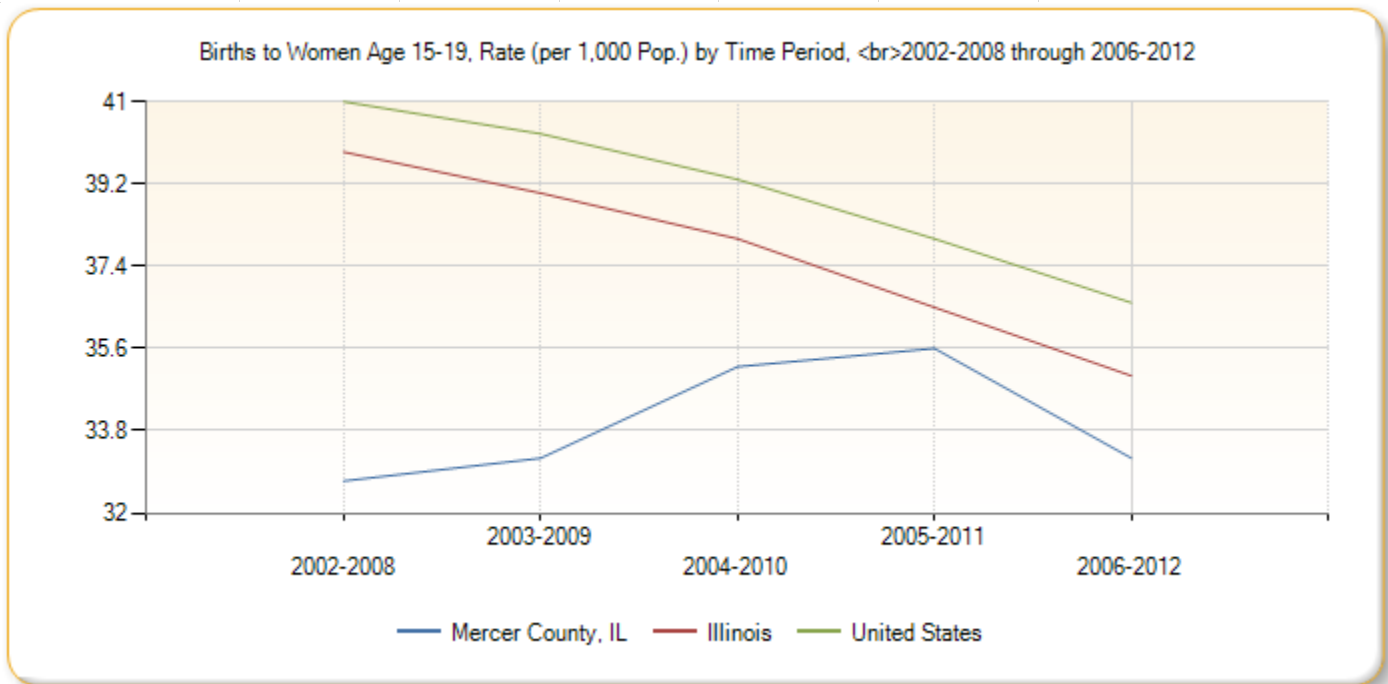


Births to Females Age 15-19, Rate (Per 1,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2006-12

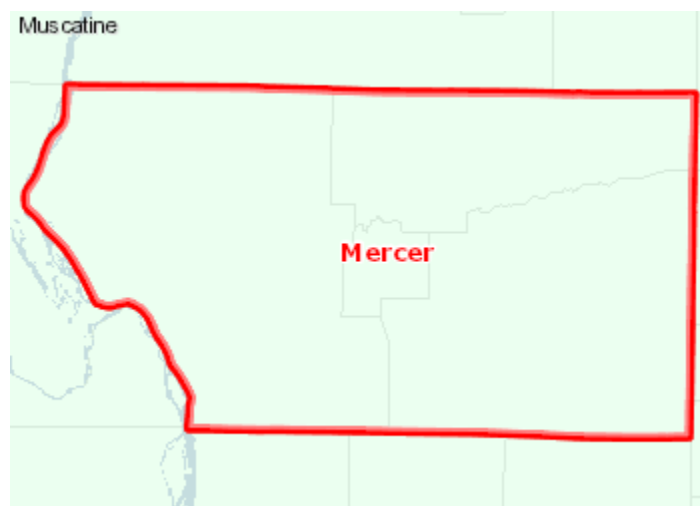

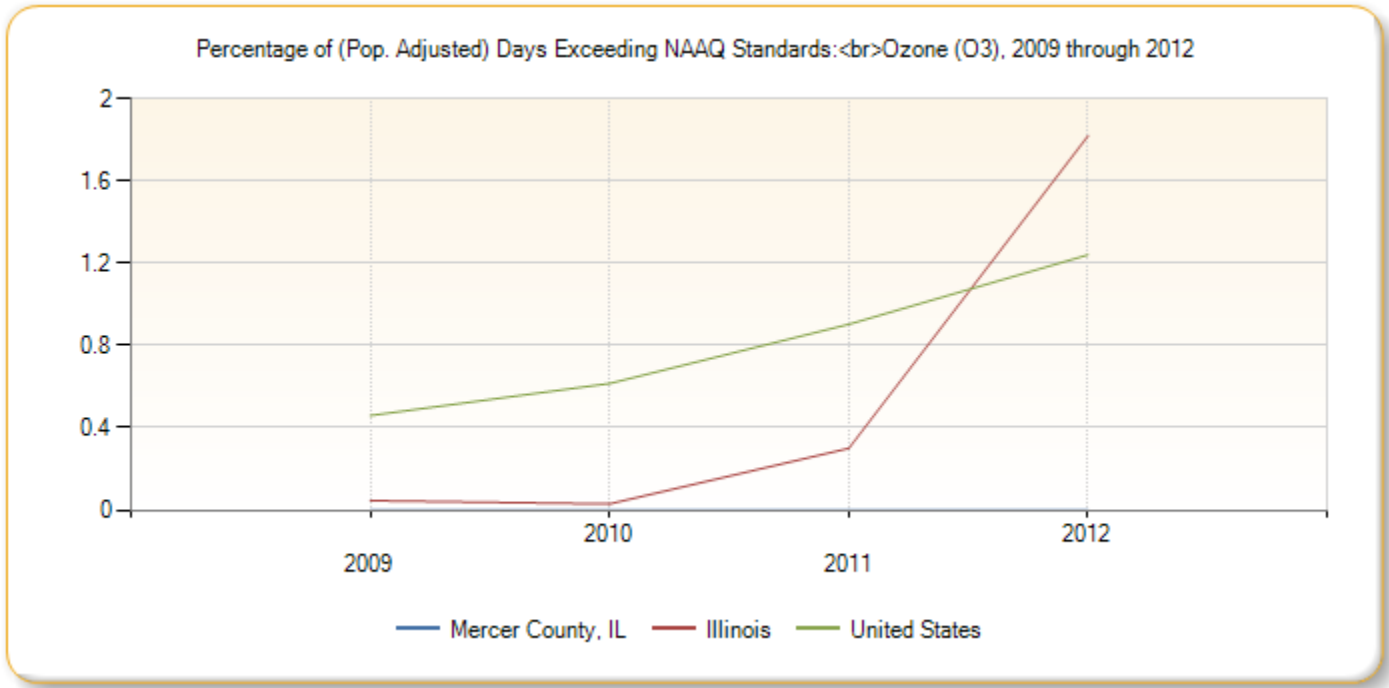


Ozone Levels (O3), Percentage of Days Above NAAQ Standards by Tract, NEPHTN 2012

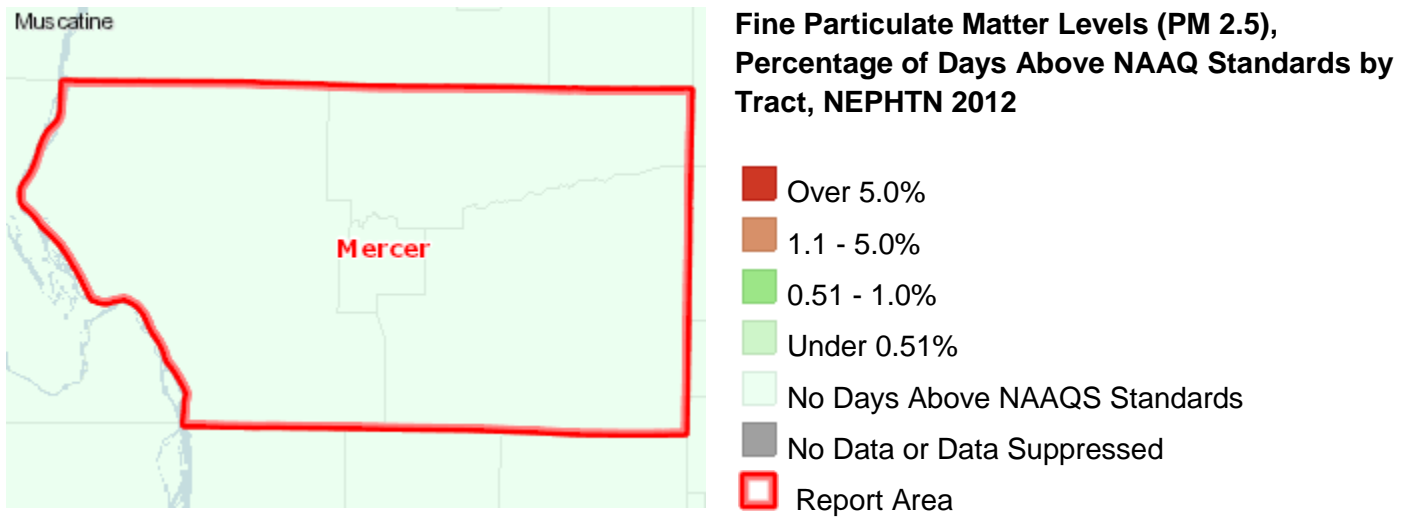

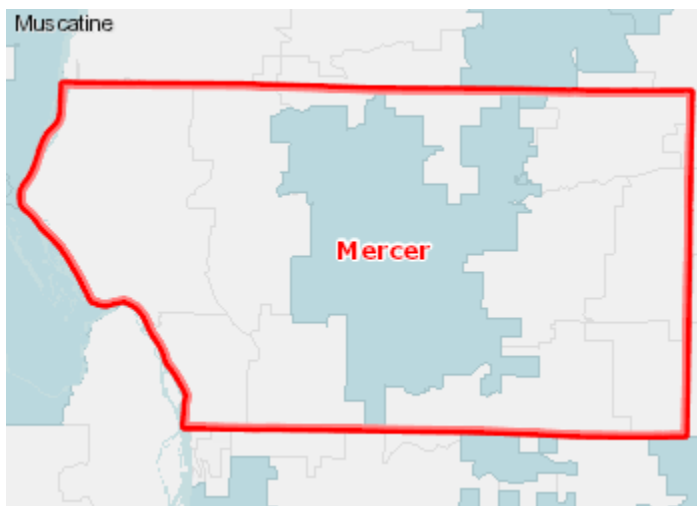

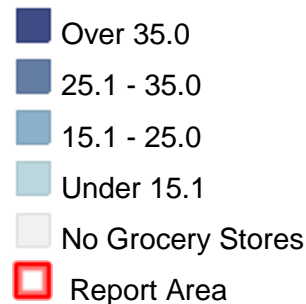

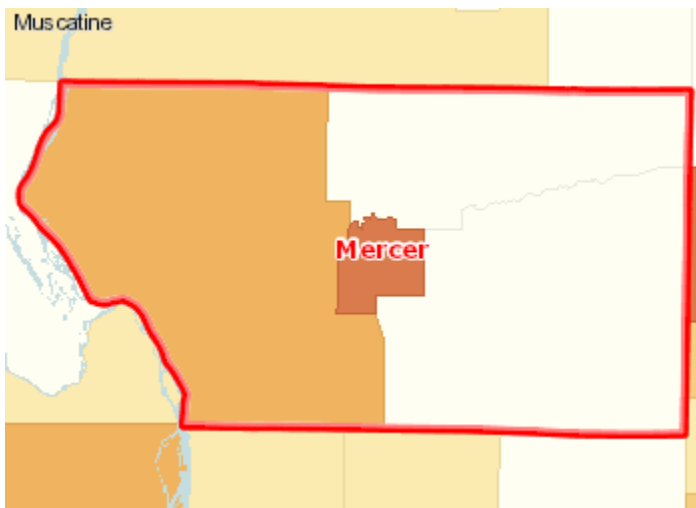

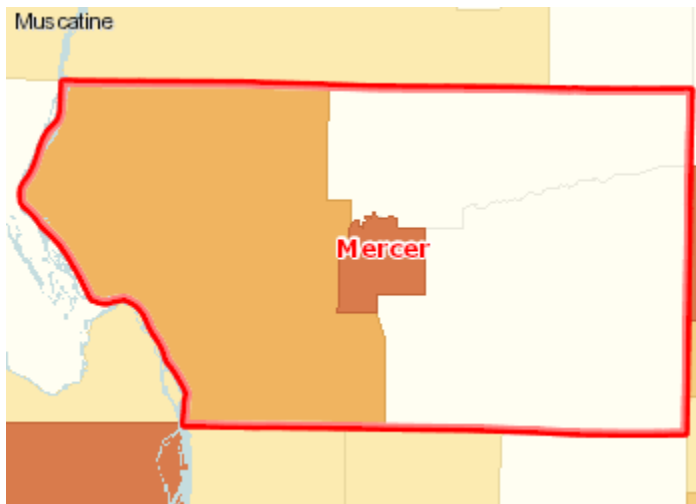

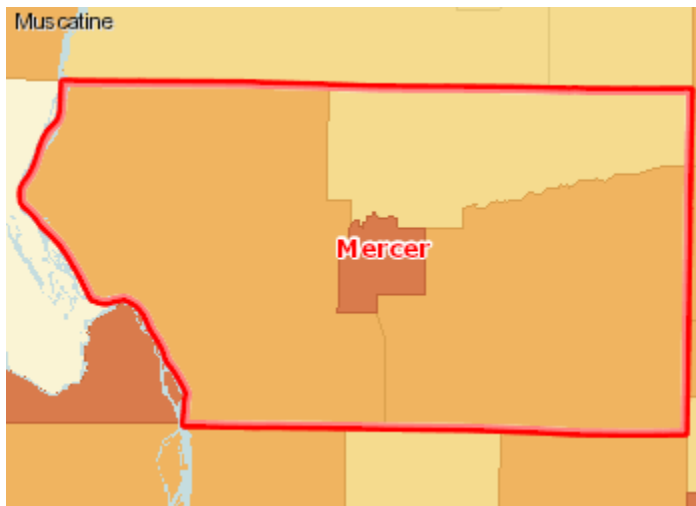

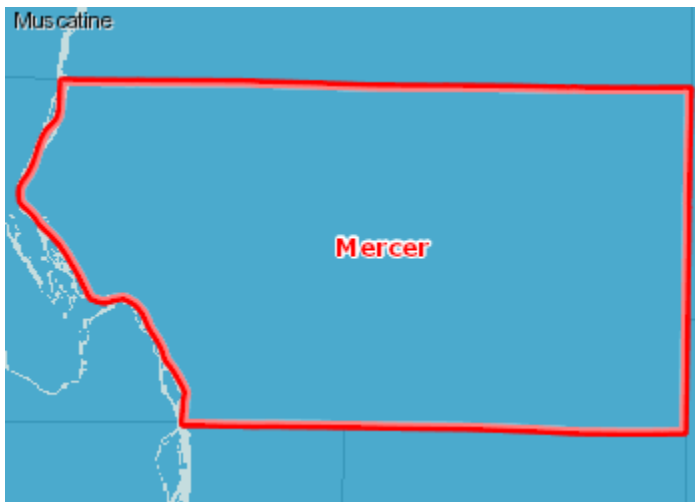

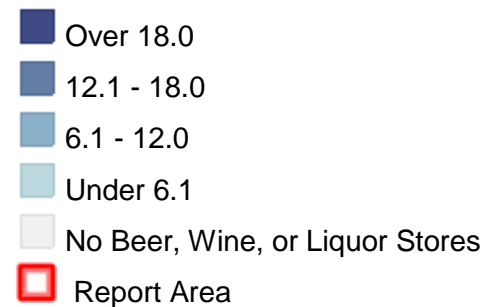

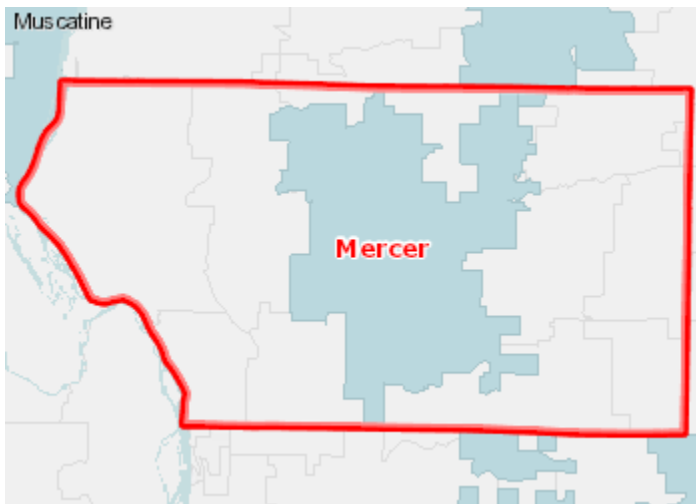

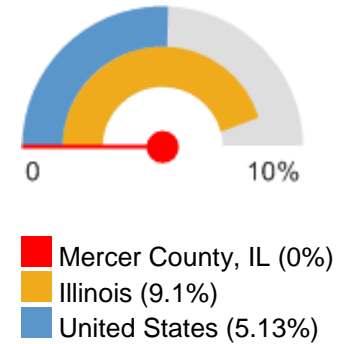

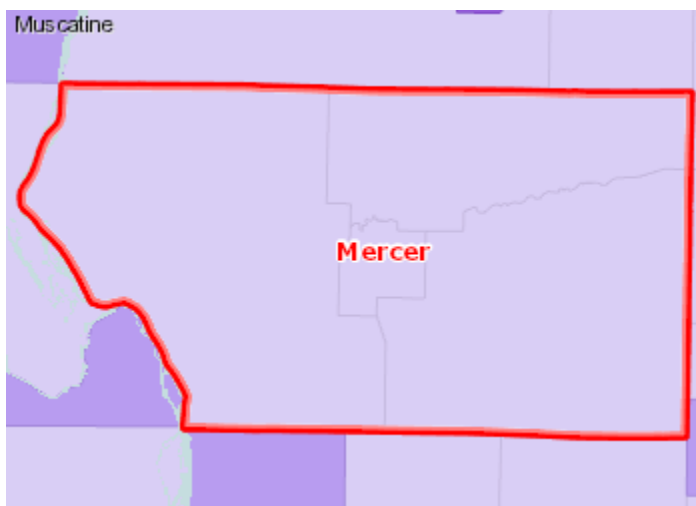

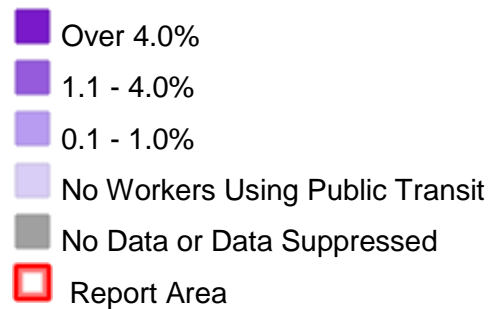
Percent Population Using Public Transit for Commute to Work

Clinical Care

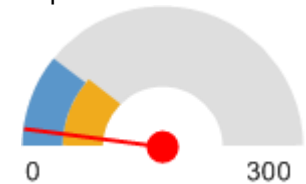

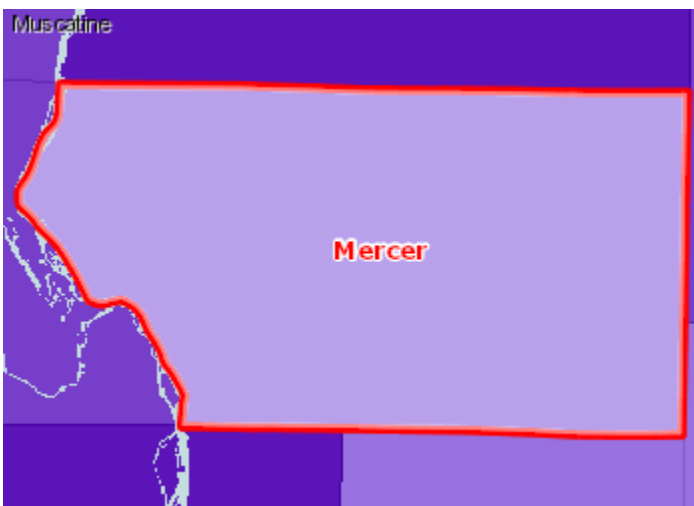

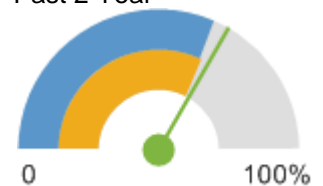

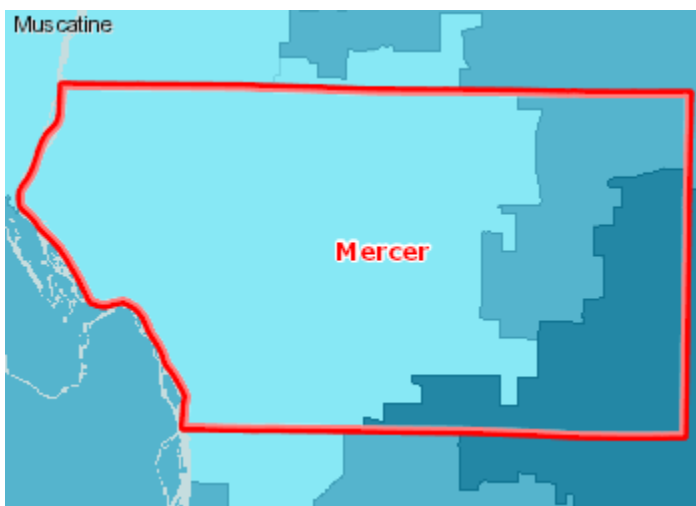

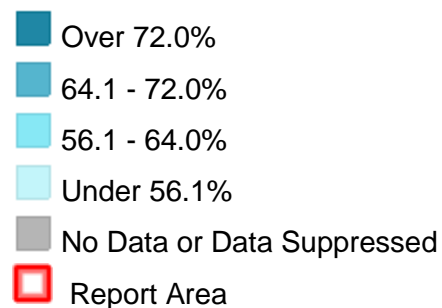
Percent Female Medicare Enrollees with Mammogram in Past 2 Year

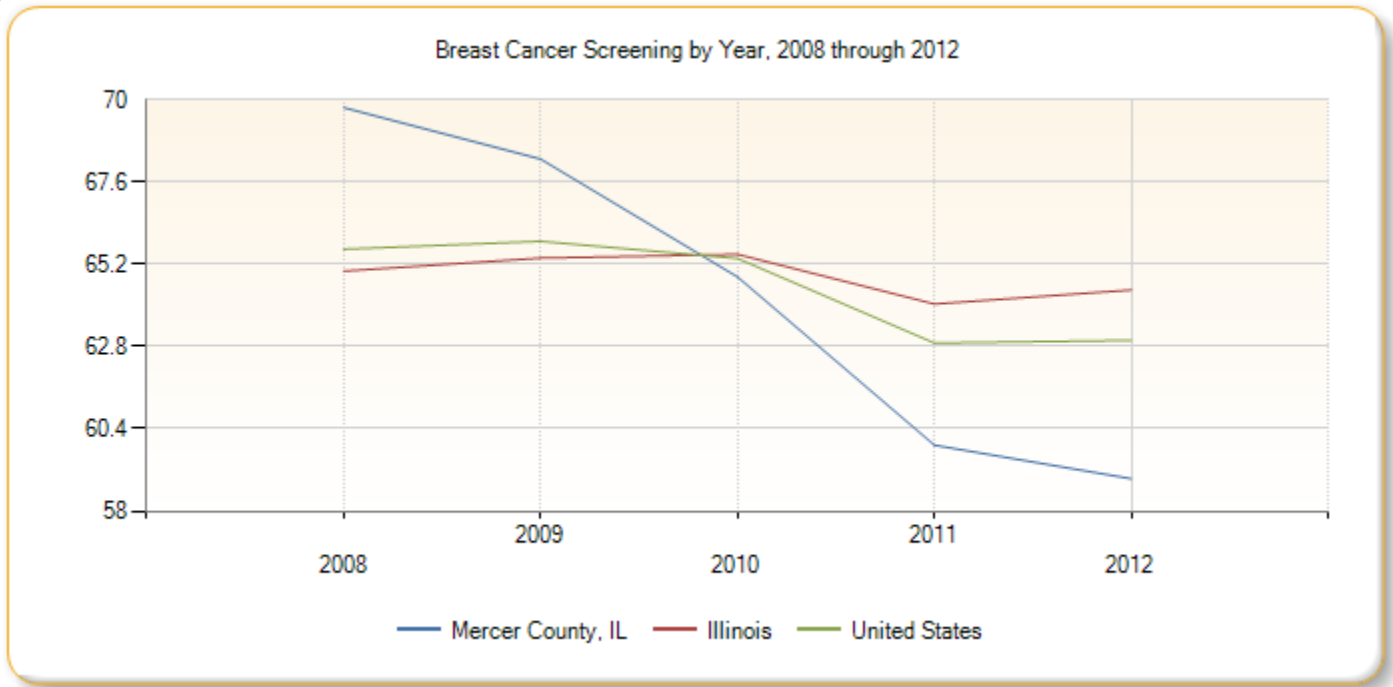

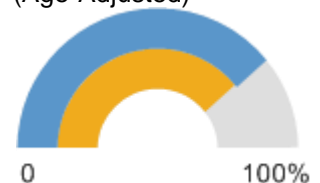

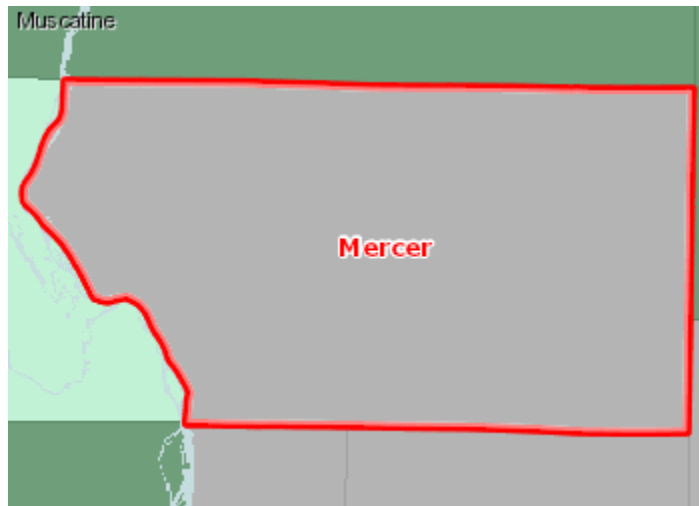
Percent Adults Females Age 18 with Regular Pap Test (Age-Adjusted)



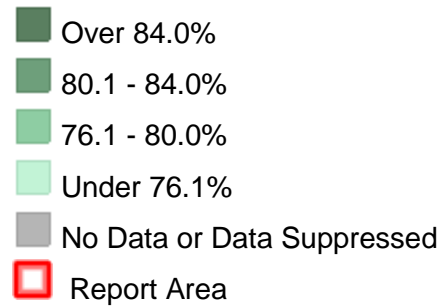

Cervical Cancer Screening (Past 3 Years), Percent of Women Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

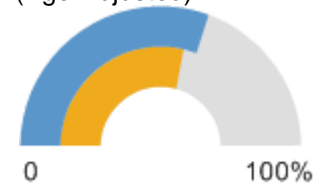

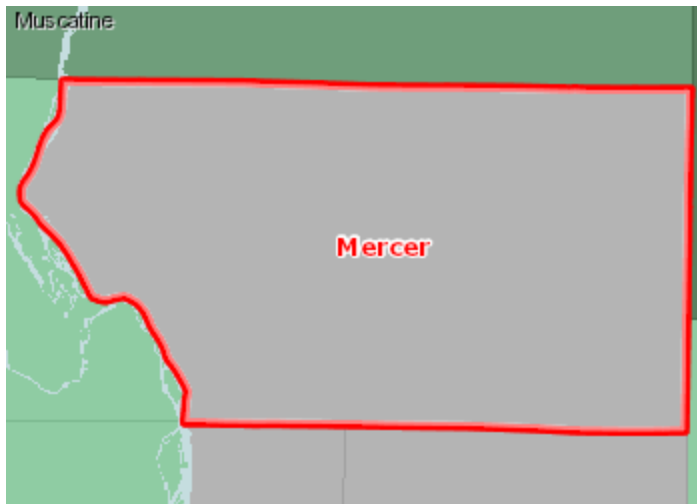

Colon Cancer Screening (Ever), Percent of Adults Age 50 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

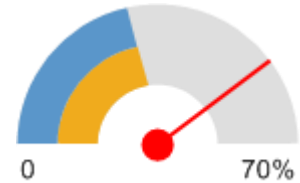

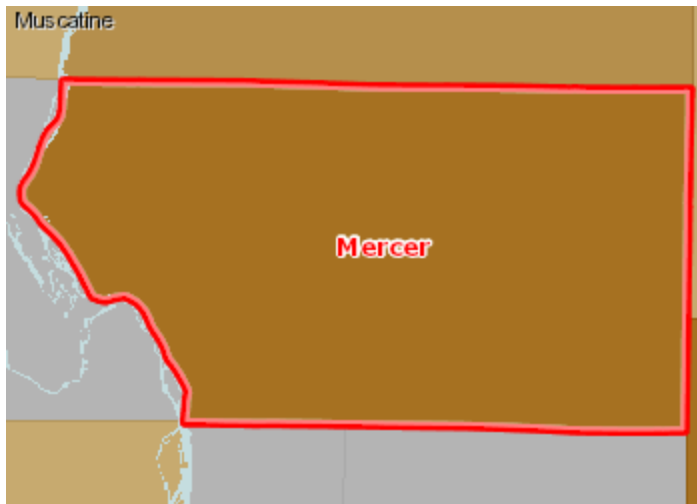

Adults Age 18 Without Dental Exam in Past 12 Months, Percent by County, BRFSS 2006-10

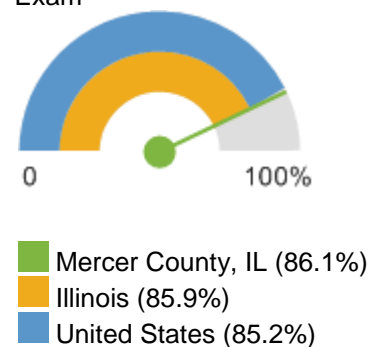

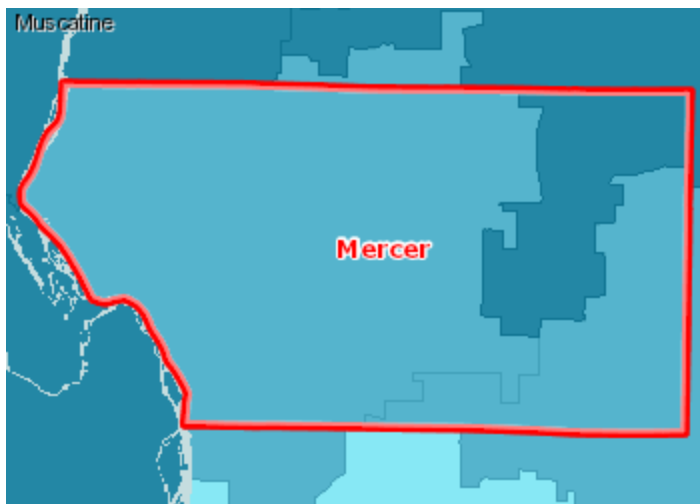

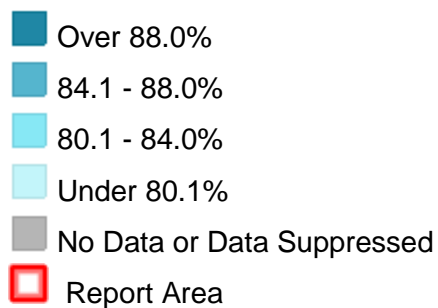
Percent Medicare Enrollees with Diabetes with Annual Exam

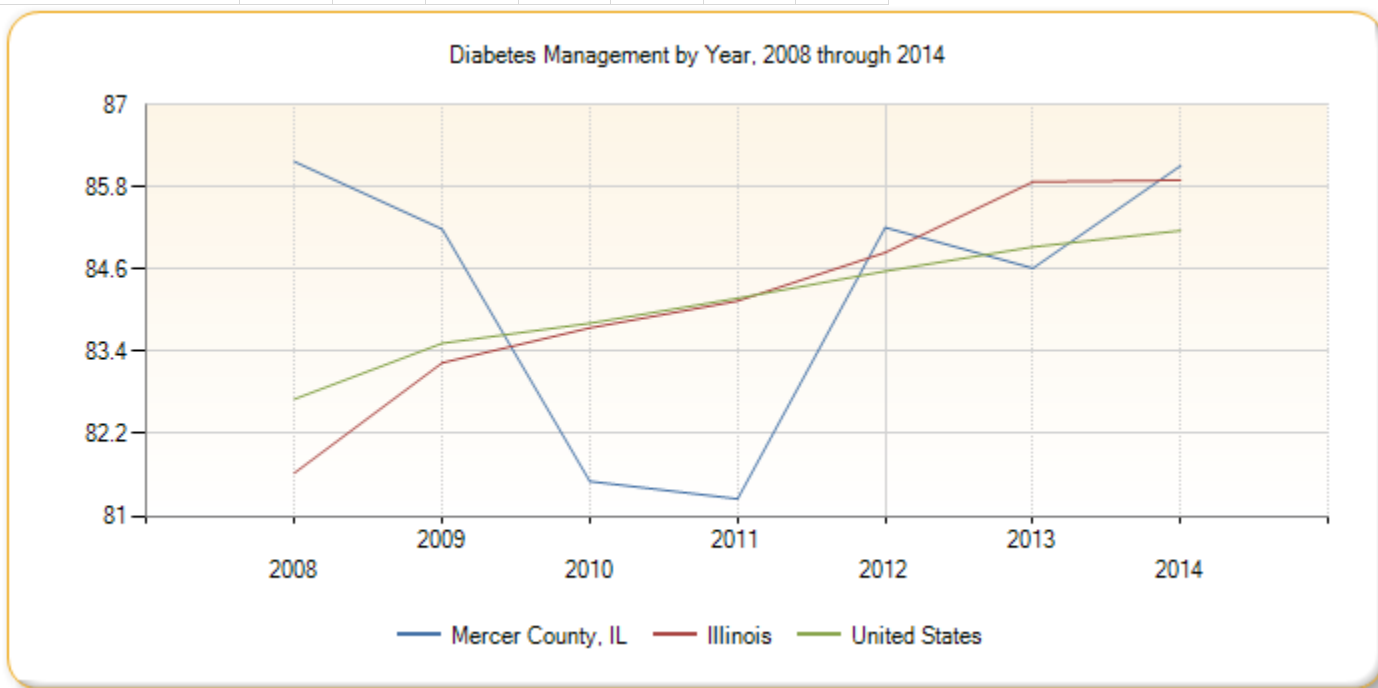

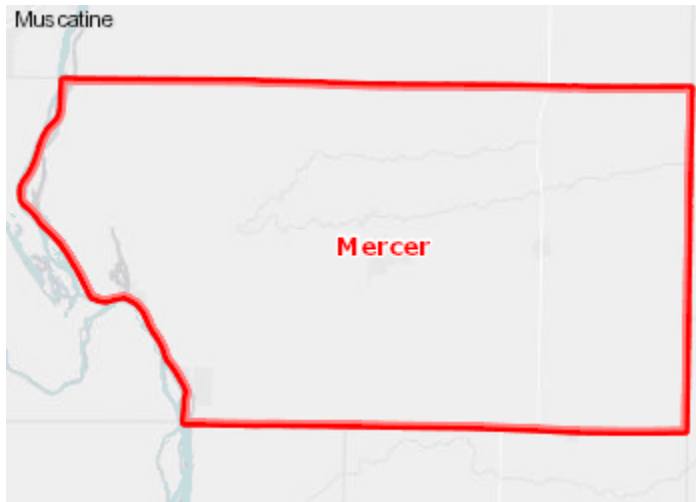

Adults Age 18 Never Screened for HIV / AIDS, Percent by County, BRFSS 2011-12

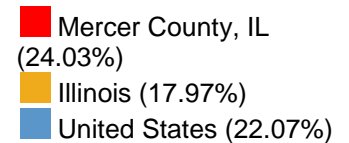

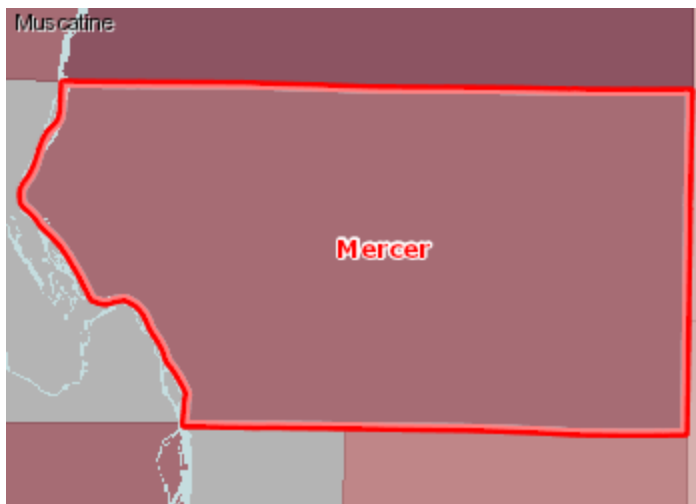

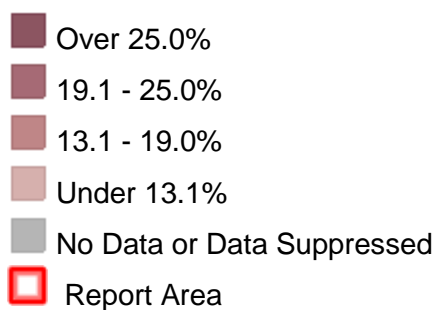

No Consistent Source of Primary Care, Percentage of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2011-12

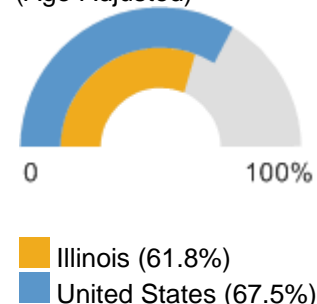

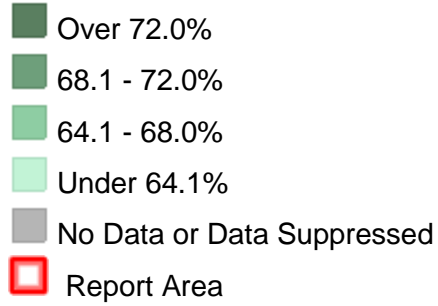
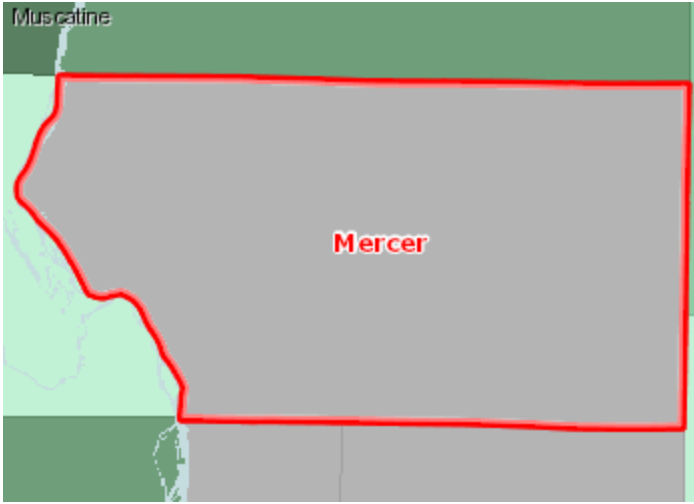

Annual Pneumonia Vaccination, Percent of Adults Age 65 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

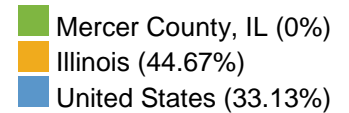
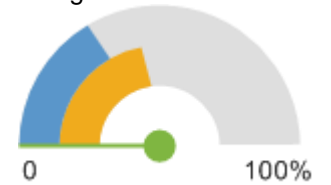

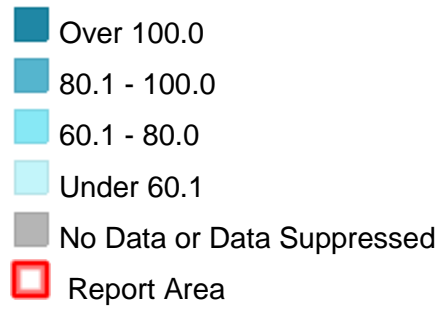
Preventable Hospital Events, Age-Adjusted Discharge Rate (Per 1,000 Medicare Enrollees)

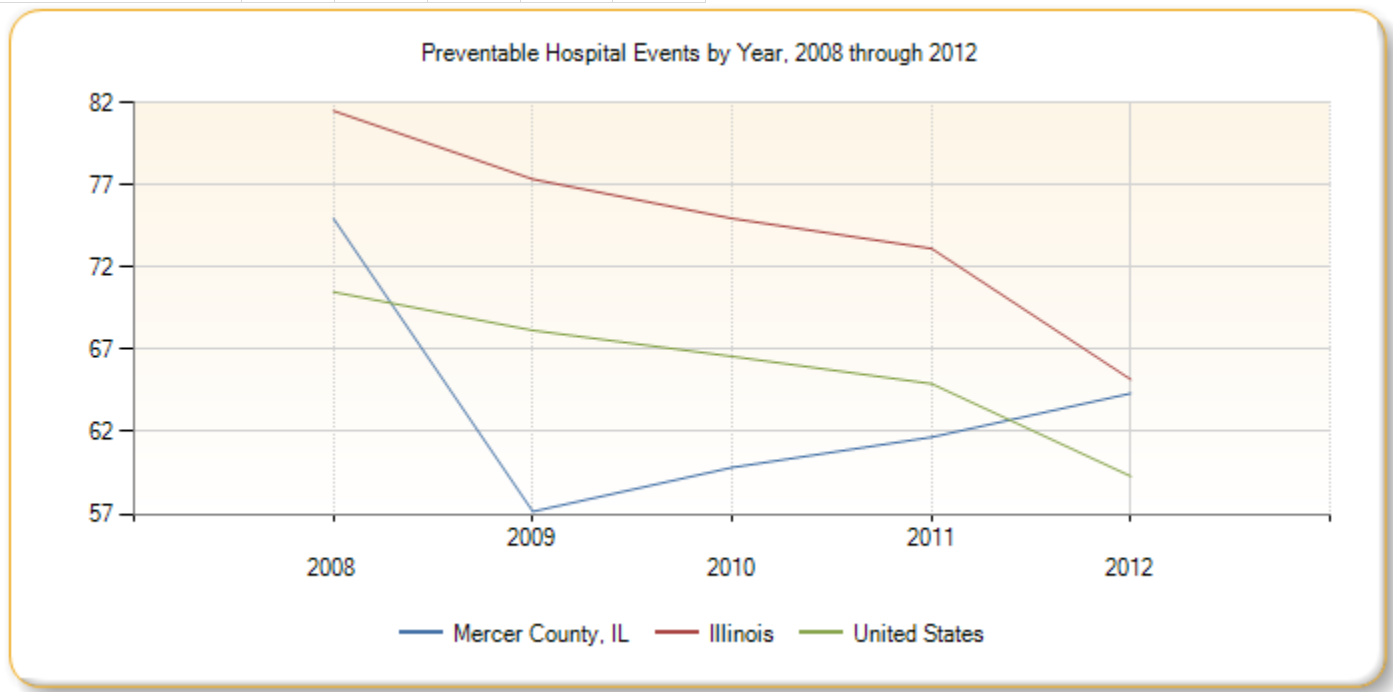

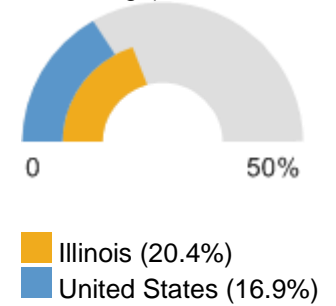

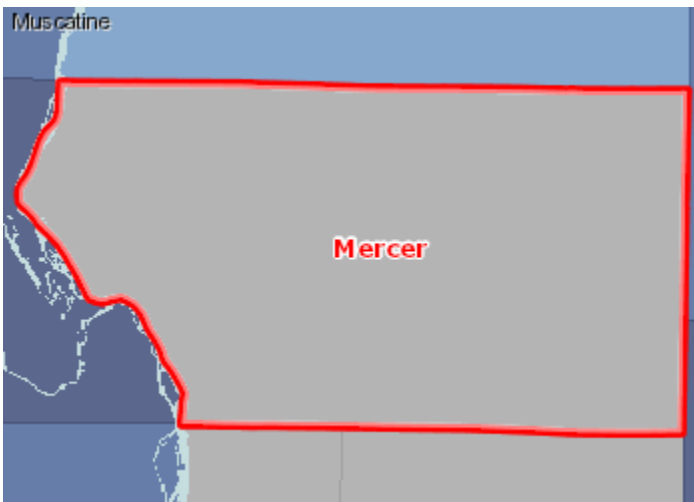

Excessive Drinking, Percent of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

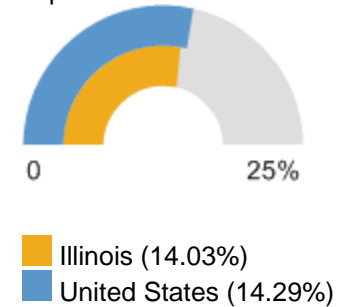

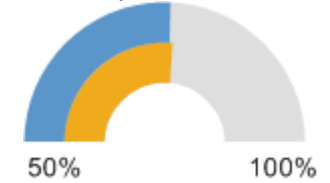

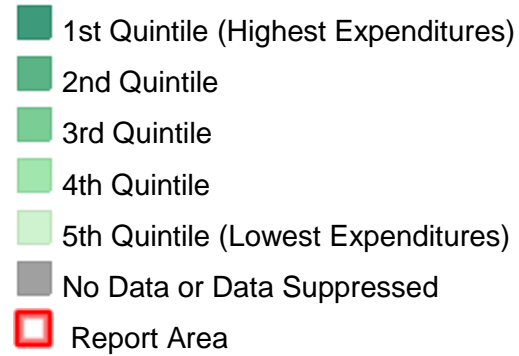
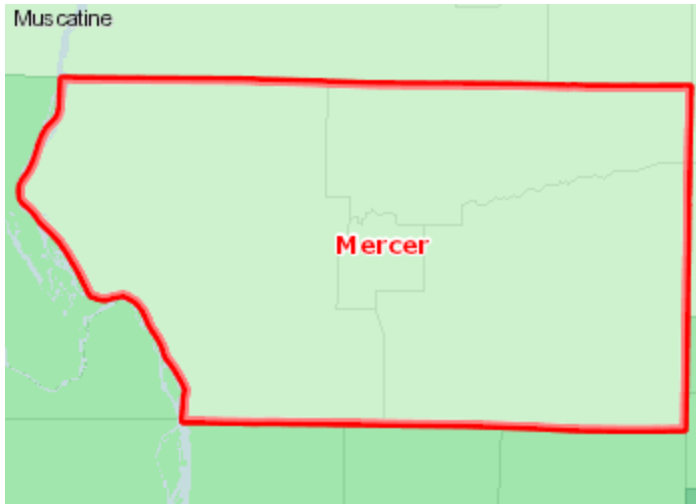
Fruit / Vegetable Expenditures, Percentage of Total Food-At-Home Expenditures

Fruit and Vegetable Expenditures, Percent of Food-At-Home Expenditures, National Rank by Tract, Nielsen 2014

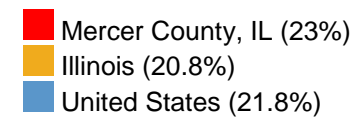
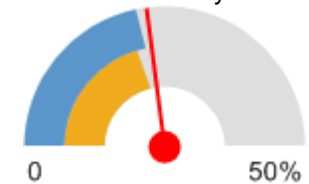

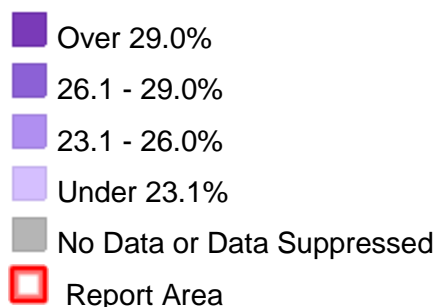
Percent Population with no Leisure Time Physical Activity

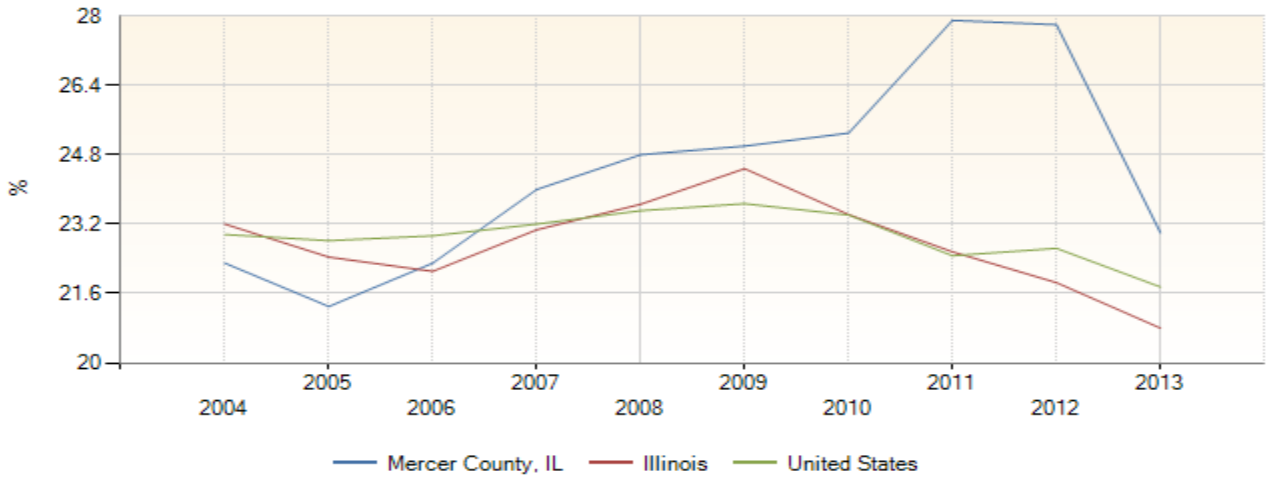

Percent Adults Physically Inactive by Year, 2004 through 2012

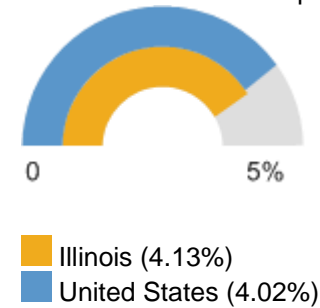

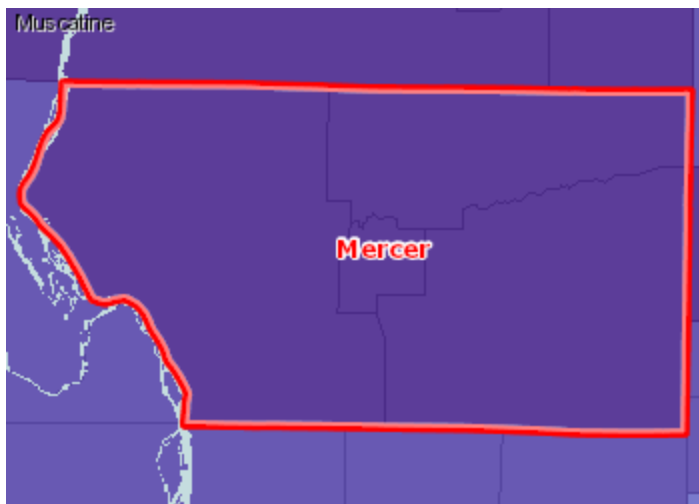

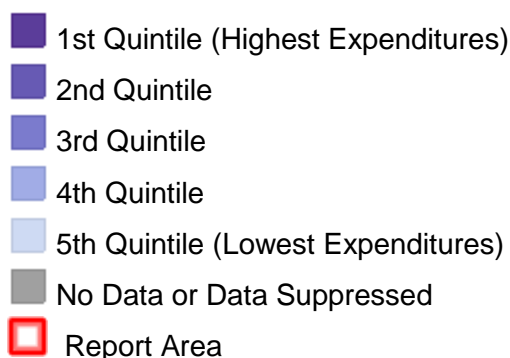
Soda Expenditures, Percentage of Total Food-At-Home Expenditures

Soda Expenditures, Percent of Food-At-Home Expenditures, National Rank by Tract, Nielsen 2014

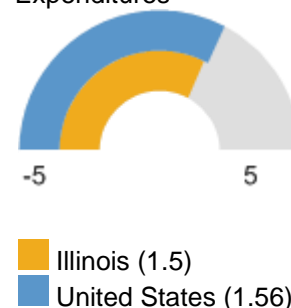

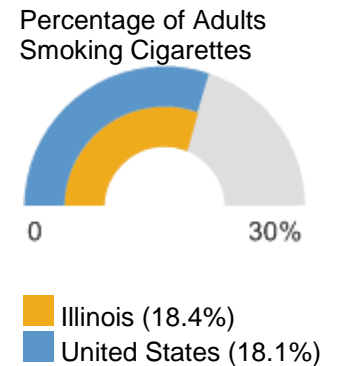
Cigarette Expenditures, Percent of Total Expenditures, National Rank by Tract, Nielsen 2014



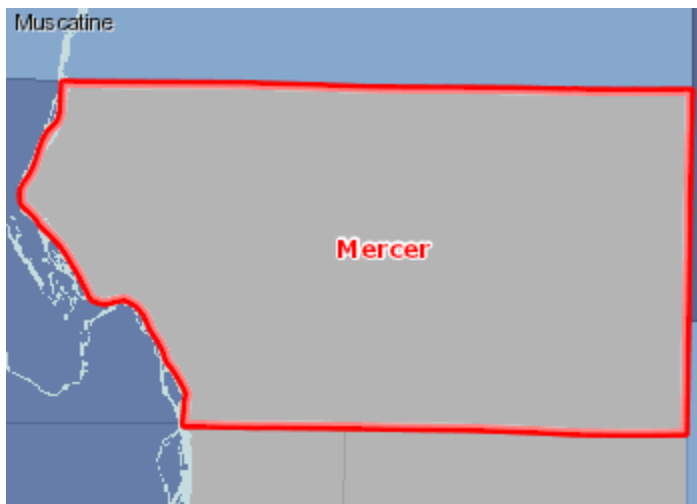

Current Smokers, Adult, Percent of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

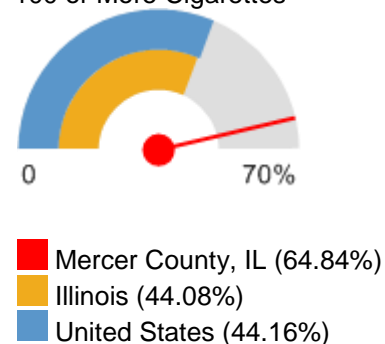

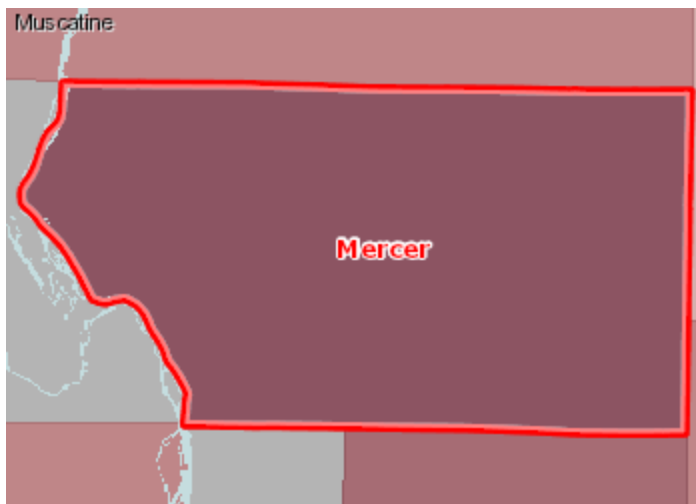

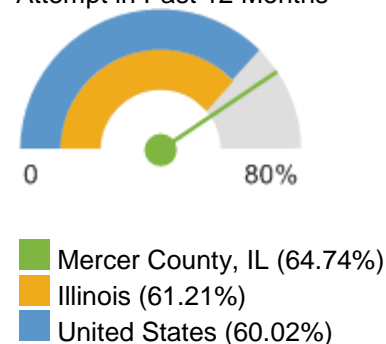

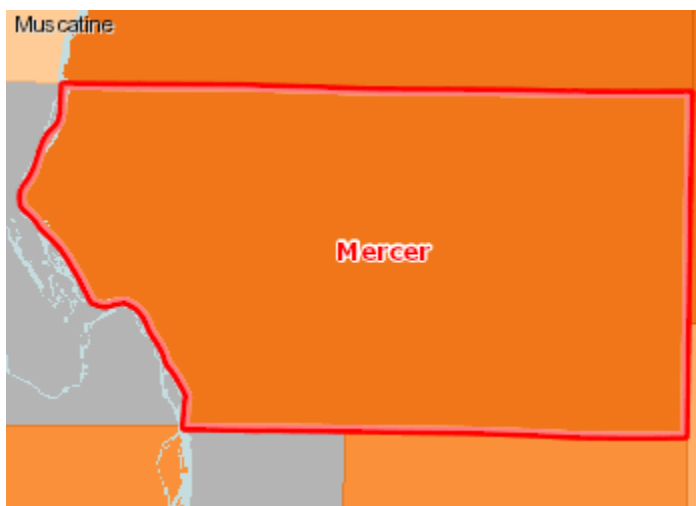

Breast Cancer, Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, State Cancer Profiles 2010-14

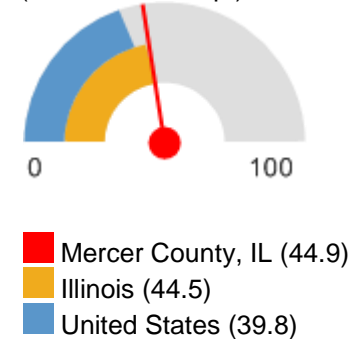

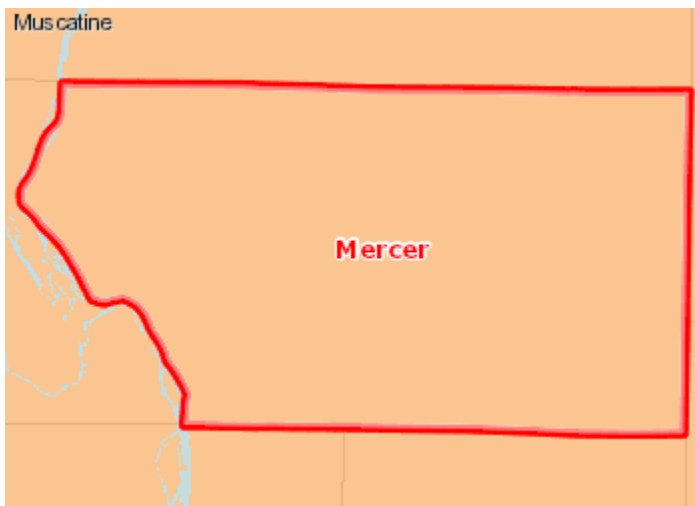

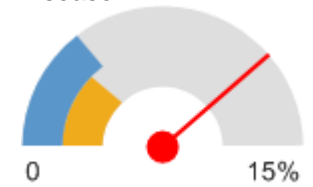

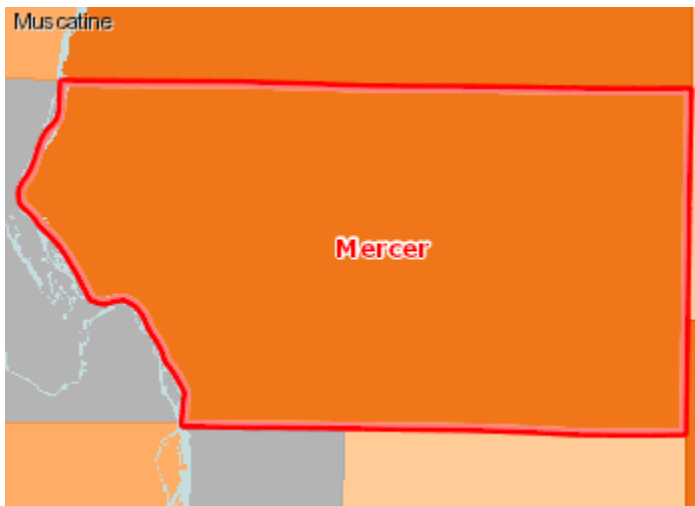

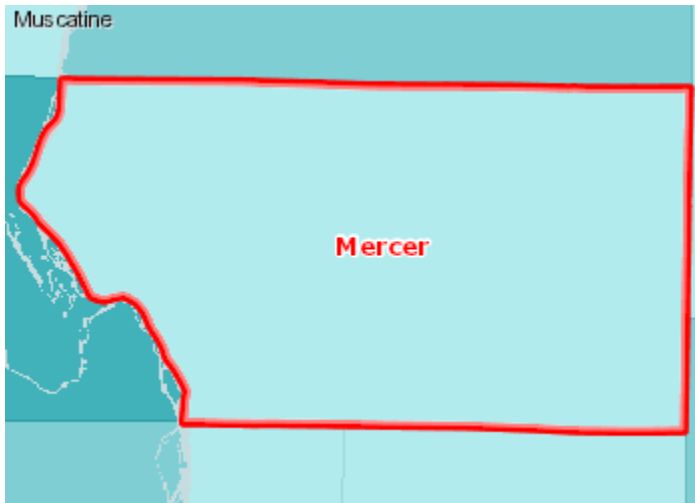

Infant Mortality, Rate (Per 1,000 Live Births) by County, AHRF 2006-10

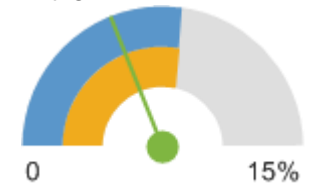

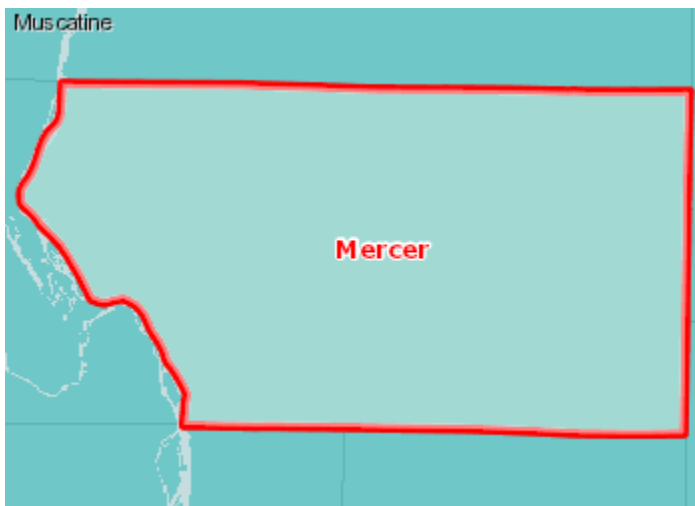

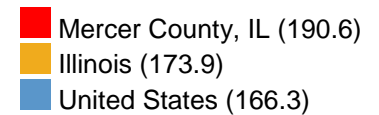

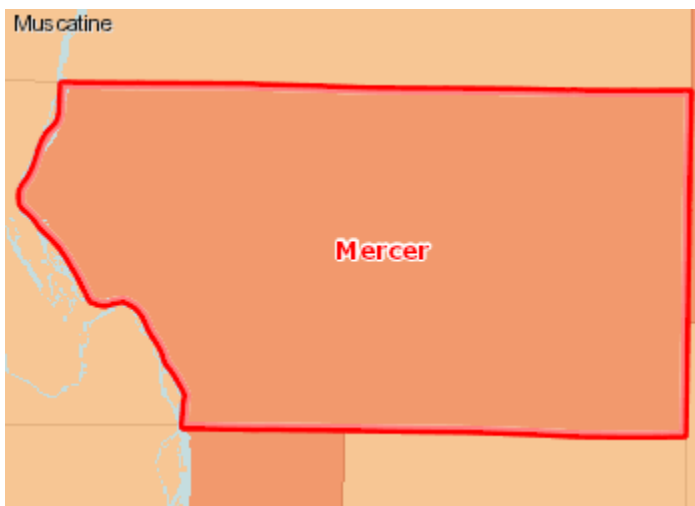

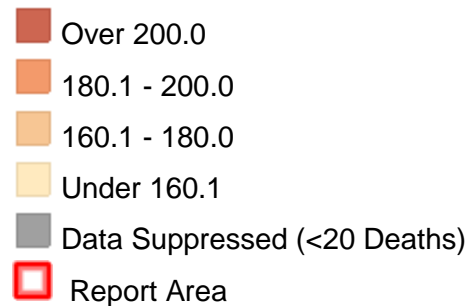
Cancer Mortality, Age-Adjusted Death Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)

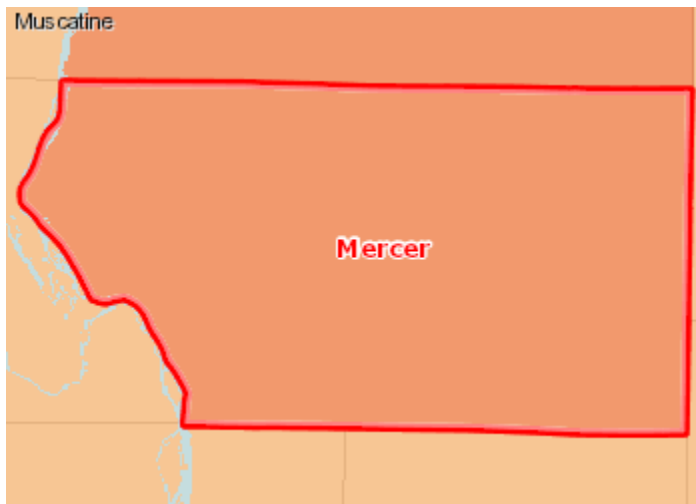

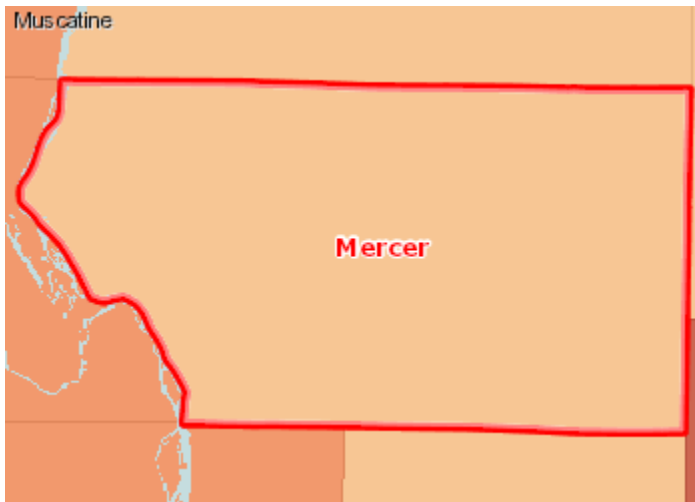

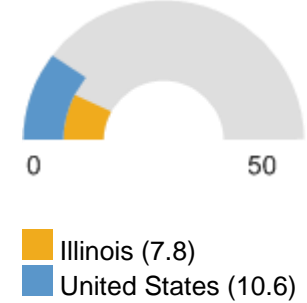

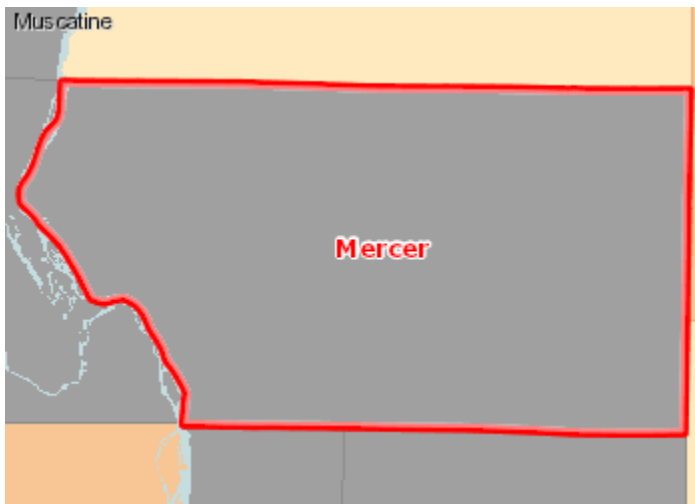

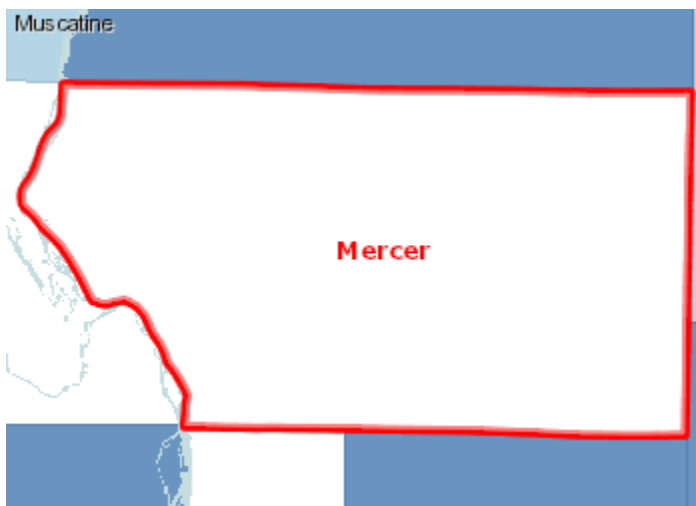

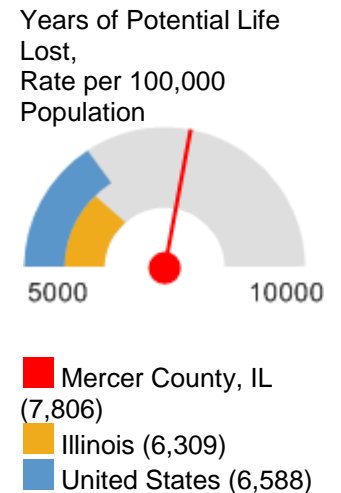
Pedestrian Motor Vehicle Crash Mortality, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NHTSA 2011-2015

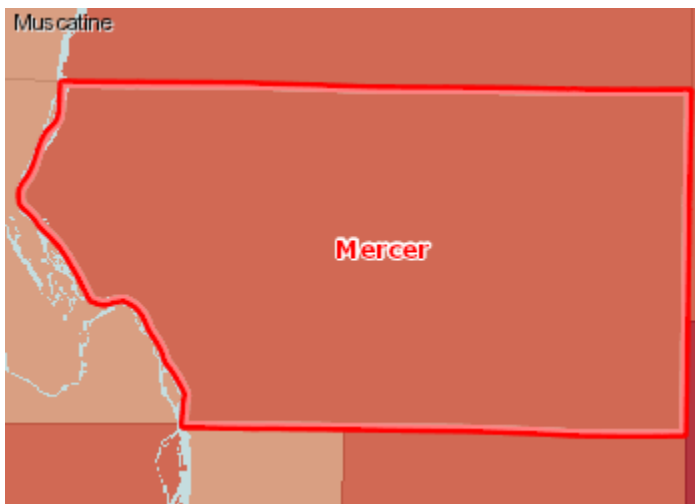

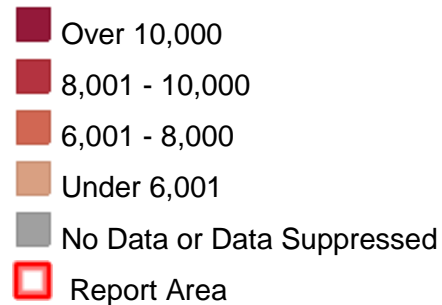

Premature Death (YPLL), Years Lost Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2011-13

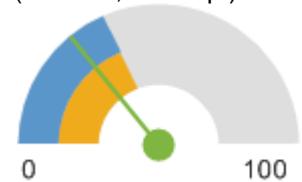

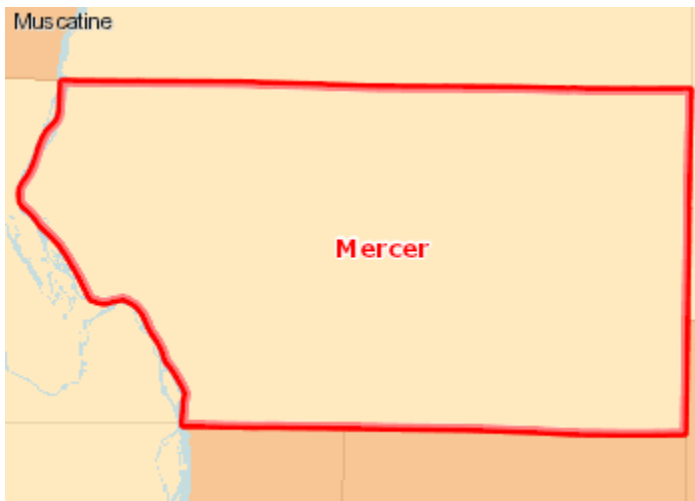

Stroke Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2010-14

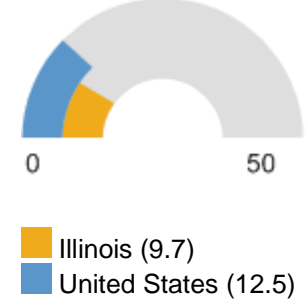

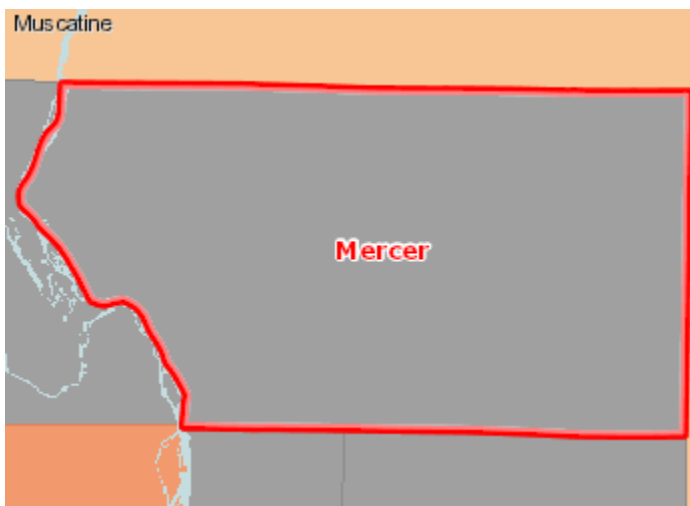

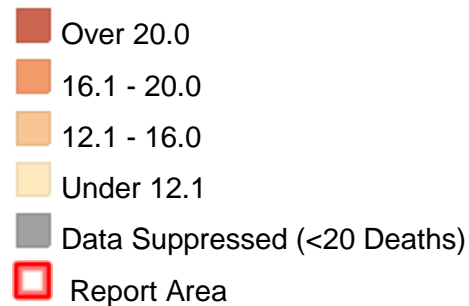
Suicide, Age-Adjusted Death Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)

Suicide Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2010-14

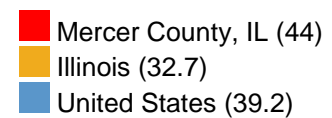

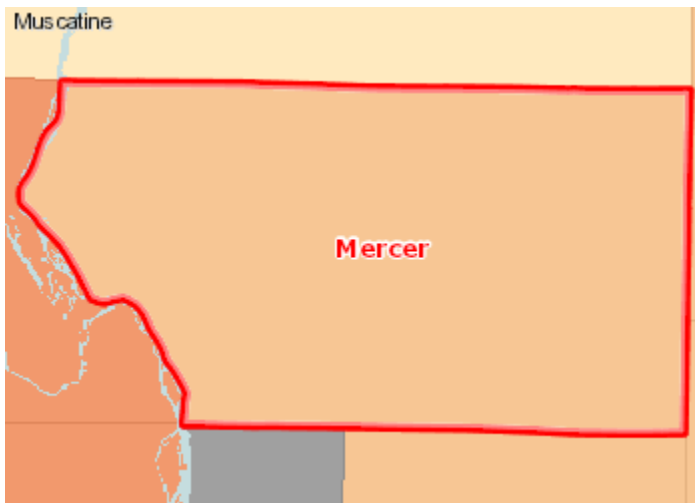

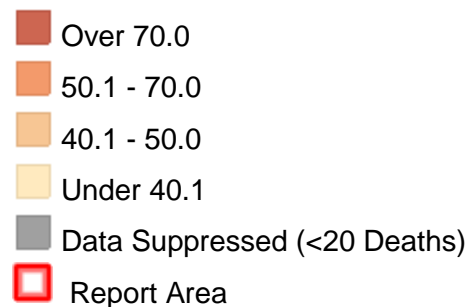
Unintentional Injury (Accident) Mortality, Age-Adjusted Death Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)

Unintentional Injury (Accident) Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2010-14

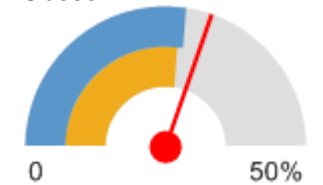

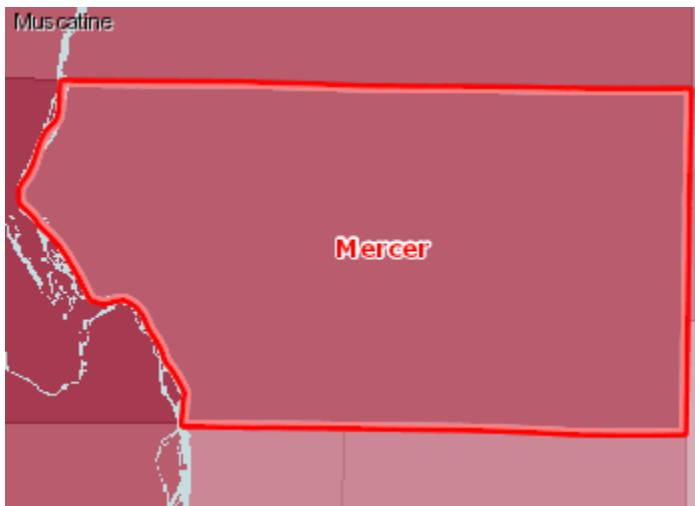

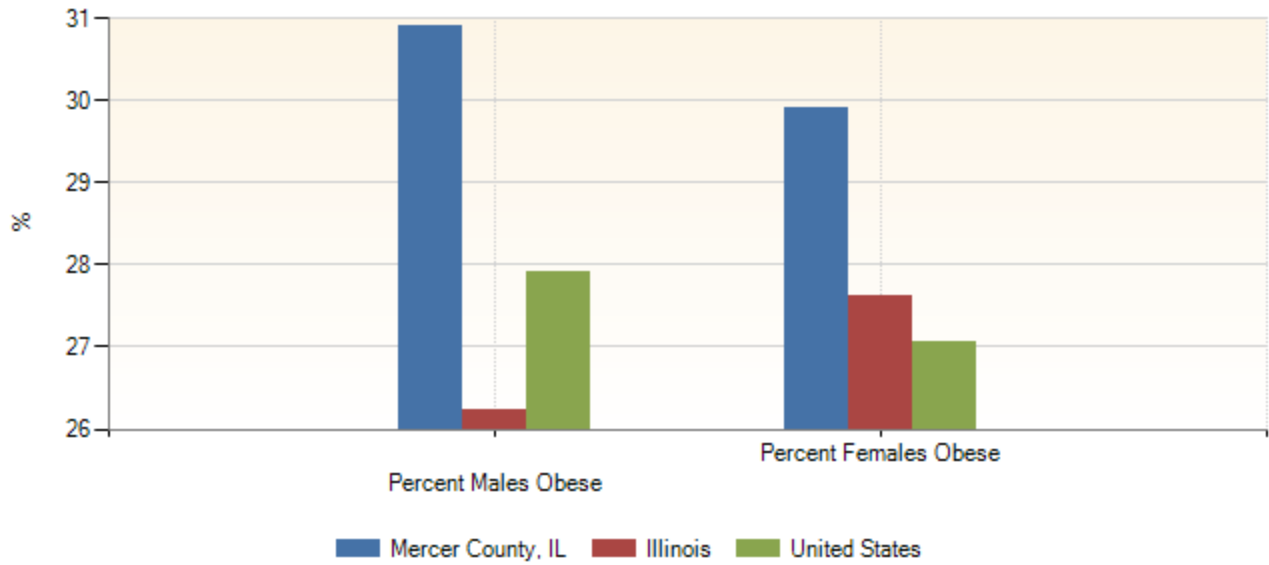

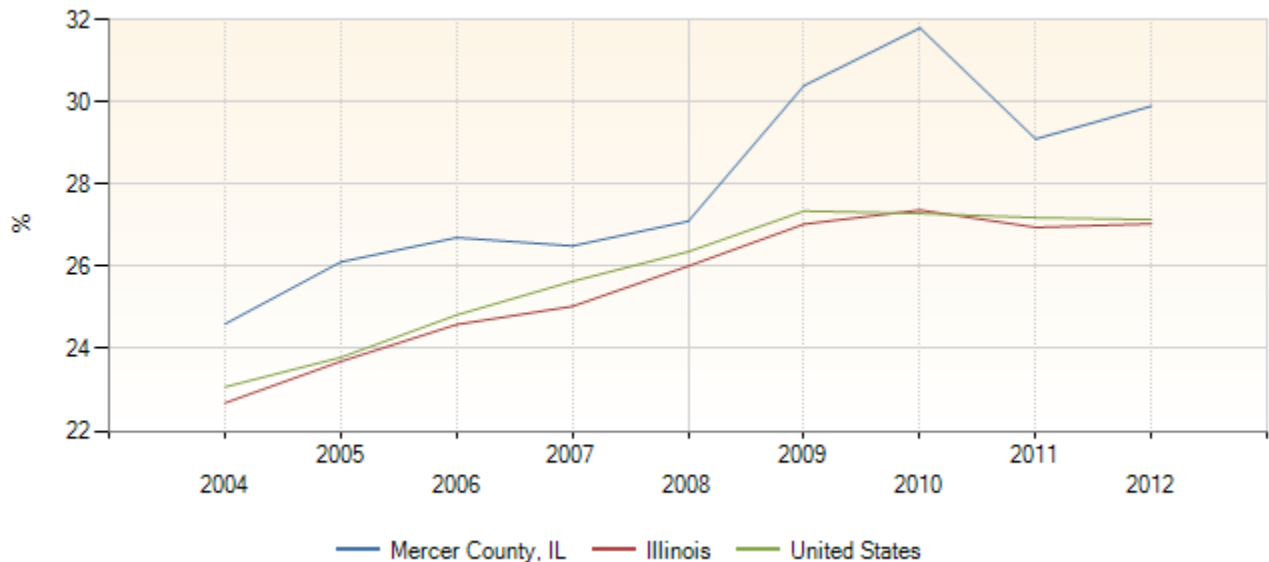
Adults Obese (BMI > 30.0) by Gender

Percent Adults Obese (BMI > 30.0) by Year, 2004 through 2012

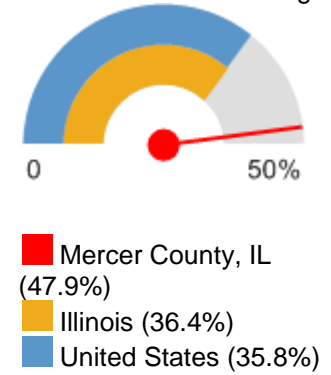

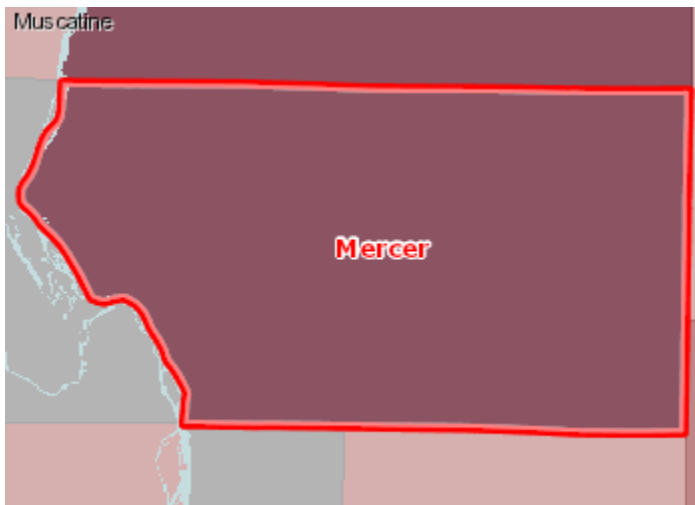

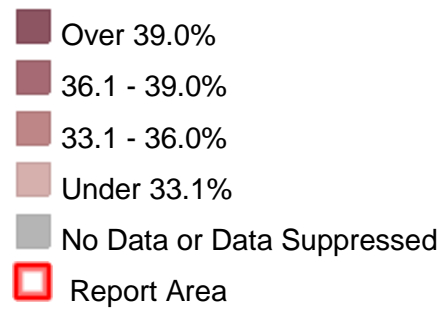
Percent Adults Overweight

Overweight (BMI 25.0-29.9), Adults Age 18 , Percent by County, BRFSS 2011-12

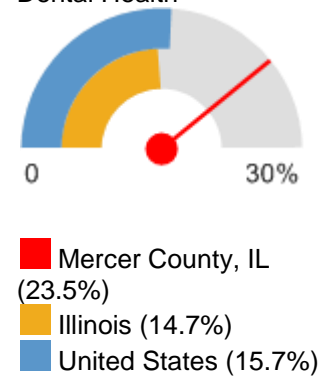

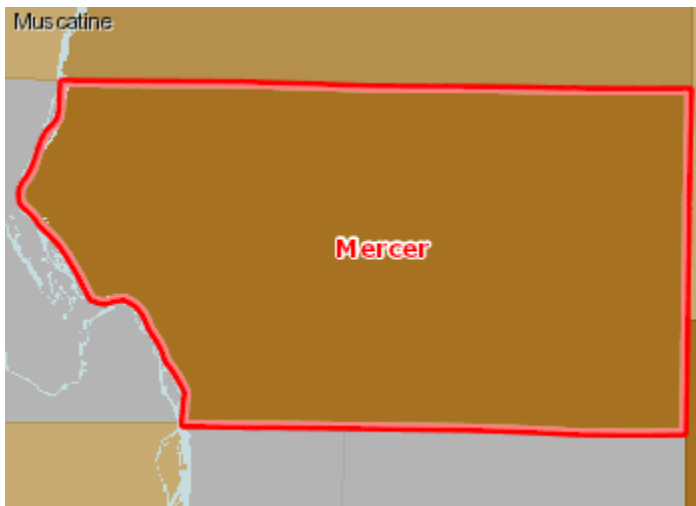

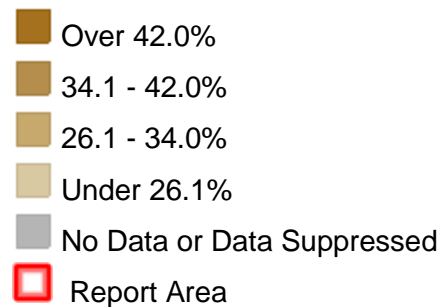
Percent Adults with Poor Dental Health

Adults Age 18 Without Dental Exam in Past 12 Months, Percent by County, BRFSS 2006-10

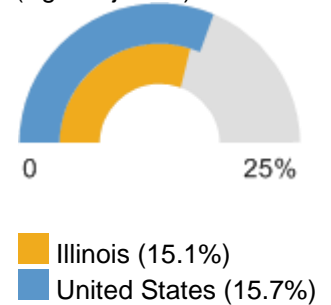

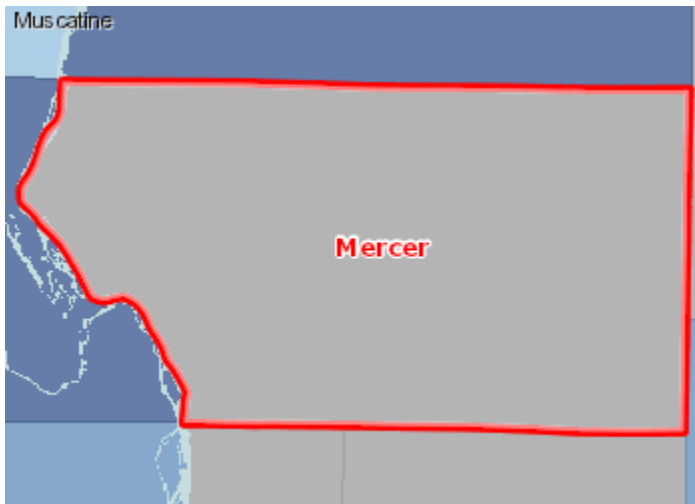

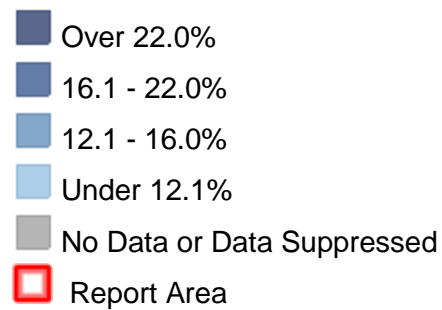
Percent Adults with Poor or Fair Health (Age-Adjusted)

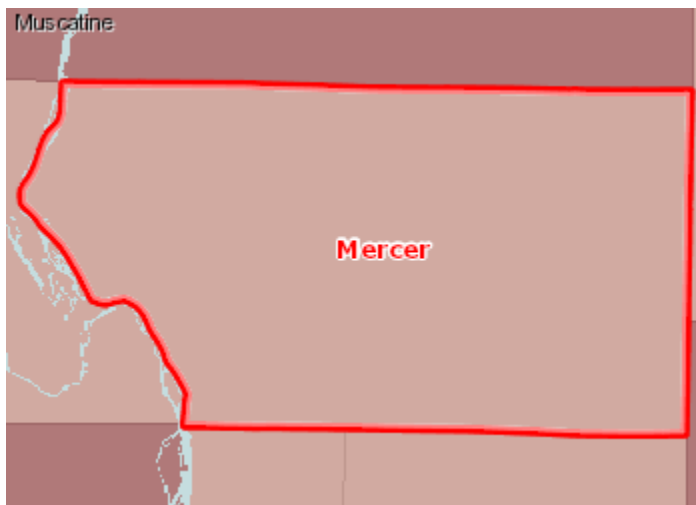

Chlamydia Infection Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)

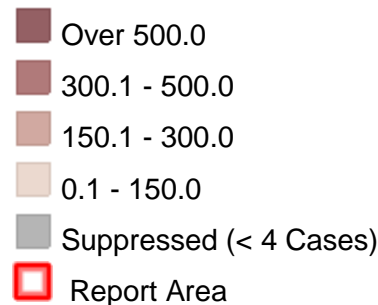

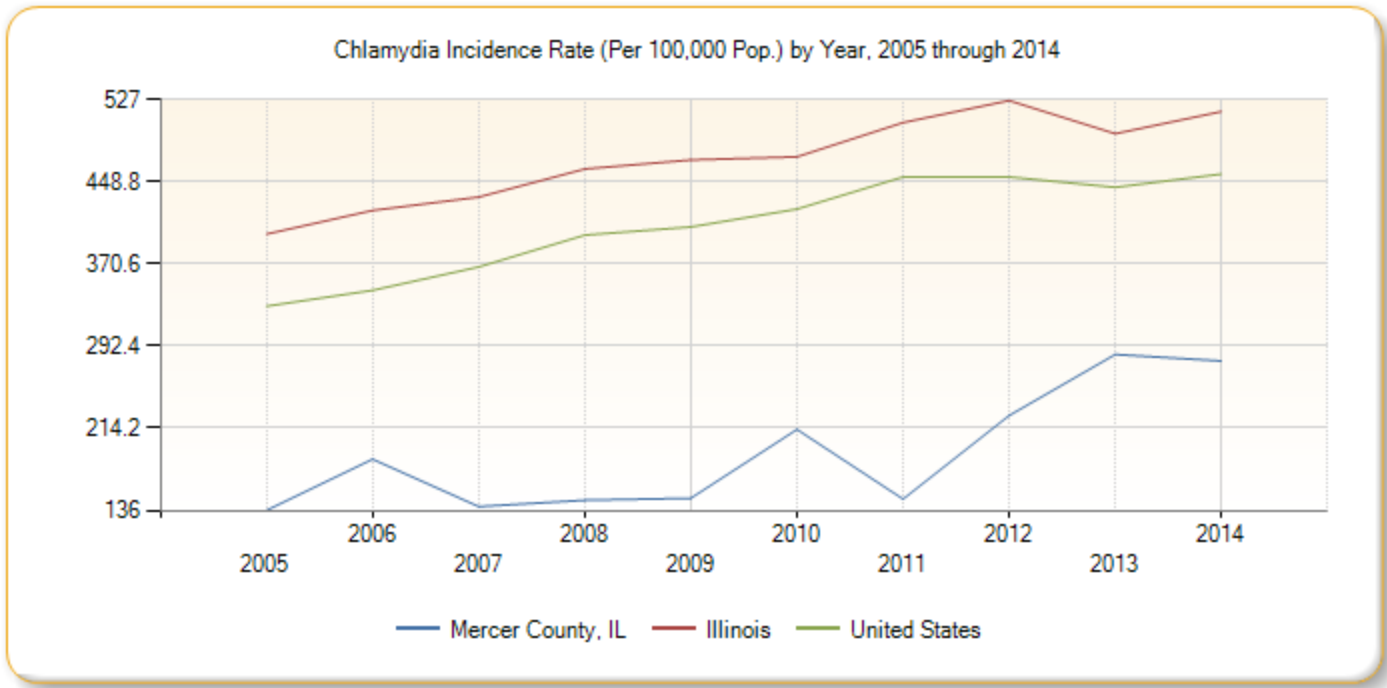


Chlamydia, Infection Rate per 100,000 Population by County, NCHHSTP 2014

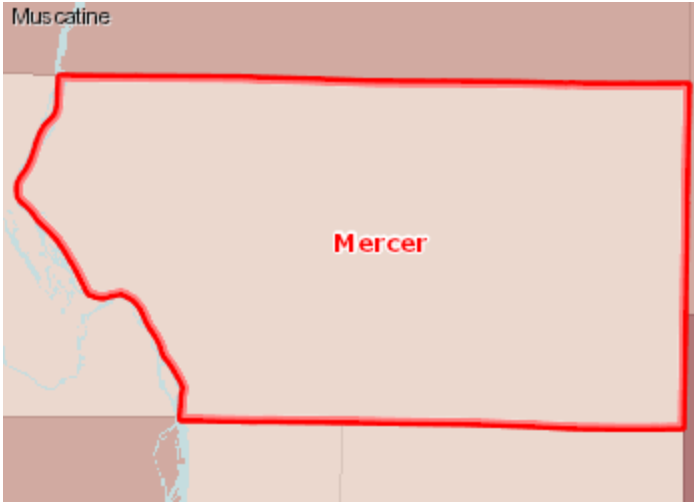

Gonorrhea, Infection Rate per 100,000 Population by County, NCHHSTP 2014

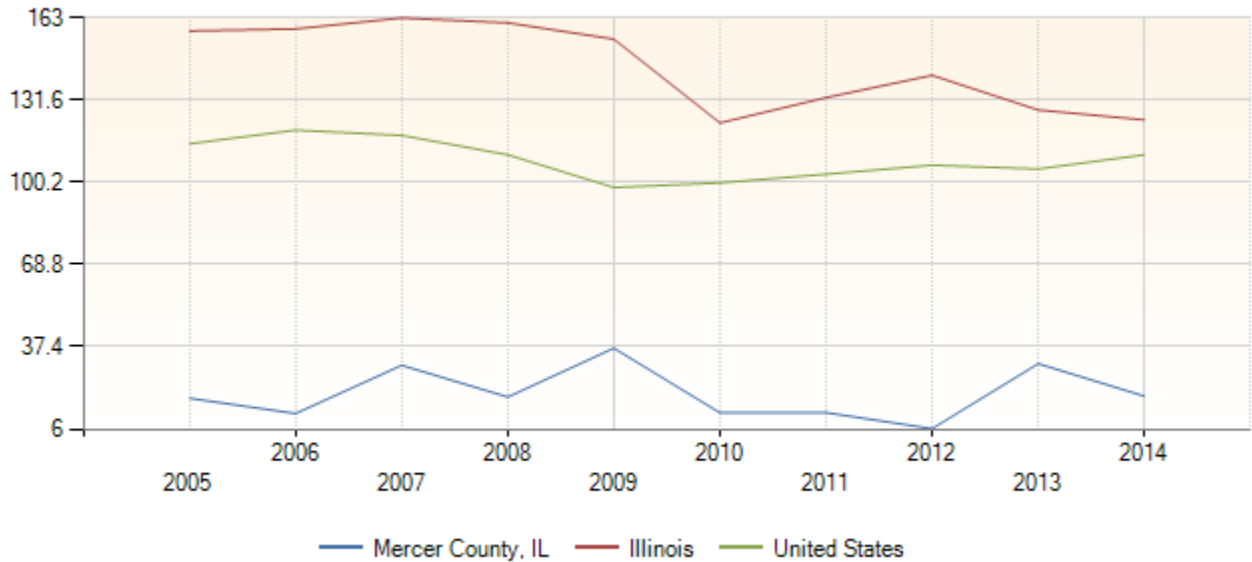

Gonorrhea Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by Year, 2005 through 2014

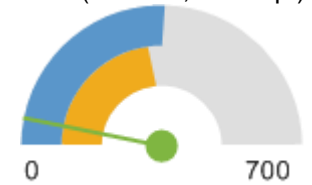

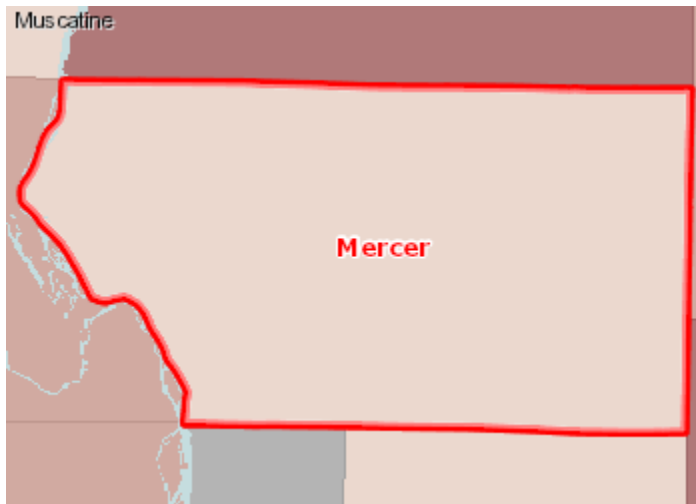

Population with HIV / AIDS, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)

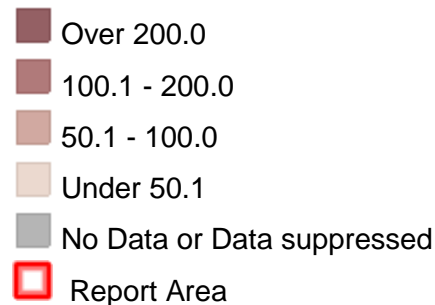
