Hybrid operating room: Cardiac and trauma solution for Siouxland

Construction continues for the MercyOne Siouxland Medical Center hybrid operating room.


A hybrid operating room (hybrid OR) is a special operating suite outfitted with advanced imaging and surgical equipment. It allows surgeons, cardiologists and interventional radiologists to perform complex minimally invasive procedures with the ability to quickly transition to a fully functional operating room if the need arises.

Crews are hard at work daily in the unused shell space in the Heart and Vascular Center. Walls are going up, the equipment has been ordered, and work continues on the heating, cooling and electrical.

Work on the nearly \$3 million investment is projected to be compete in the fall.

MercyOne Siouxland Heart and Vascular Center brings together cardiologists, cardiothoracic surgeons and vascular surgeons with advanced technology to provide comprehensive care in a state-ofthe-art facility.
